PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

WELCOME

Welcome to all students and families to Tulliallan Primary School. This year we enter our eighth year since we began in 2017. The students have settled in well yesterday reconnecting to routine and friends. We look forward to an excellent 2024 year.

TEAM TULLIALLAN PROGRAM

To help our students settle into school routine and expectations of behaviour and work ethic, the Team Tulliallan Program has started. Students and teachers develop their Code of Cooperation together that outlines expected positive behaviours linked to our School Wide Positive Behaviours and School Values. This week Home Groups will work through an induction of safe processes and routines to support student safety, responsibility and independence. Relationships is the focus for Term One, so that students can widen their friendship group and continue to foster friendships that are already formed.

THE CYBER SAFETY PROJECT IN PARTNERSHIP WITH TULLIALLAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

With growing concerns and increased incidents around students' wellbeing and safety online, we have partnered with the Cybersafety project for another year to deliver information sessions to our students from Years Three to Six on Thursday 15th and Friday 16th of February, along with staff professional learning sessions and parent webinars over the course of the year. 


