The initiative continues to provide a highly qualified and experienced teacher team to deliver the tutoring program.

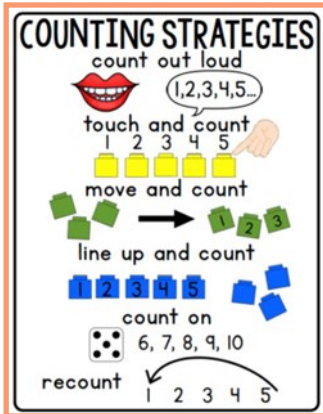

The Preps had another fantastic week! This week, we learnt the sounds 'g', 'o' and 'u' in our Reading Groups. In Writing lessons, we visited the chicks in the STEM room. We then used our senses to describe what the chicks look like, feel like and sound like. In Mathematics, we have continued learning about how to count a collection of objects up to 20 using different strategies including, 'move and count', 'line up and count' and 'count on'. Well done on another wonderful week, Preps!



YEAR ONE

We have had a fun week in the Year One Learning Community this week! During Writing we are learning how to write information reports and have been focusing on different animals' appearances, diets and habitats. We had a special visit from our school butterflies, we watched them and wrote about their appearance, habitat, and diet, and we even got to set them free into the world!

Later in the week, we had a special visitor called Murphy. Murphy is a 10-month-old Groodle puppy, Year One students enjoyed patting Murphy and brainstorming facts for their information report. In Inquiry, students have been learning about how plastics affect the environment. They have come across alternate ways to reduce single-use plastics and drew pictures of their ideas in the Inquiry lesson. In Maths, we have been using 'Think Boards' to represent numbers in different forms such as using number lines, and MAB blocks.

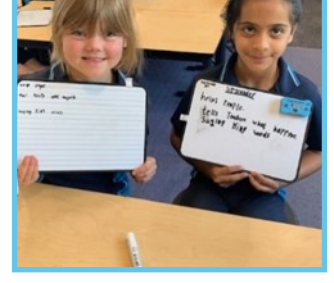
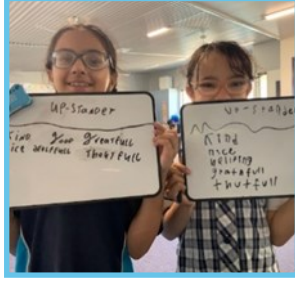
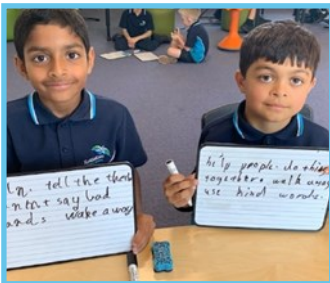

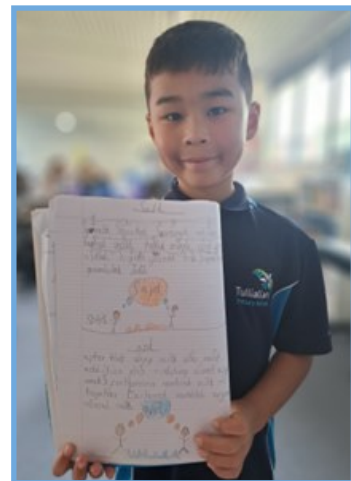
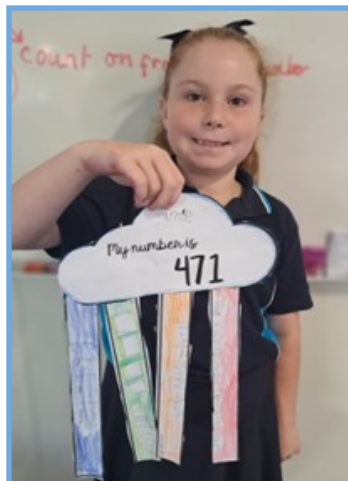
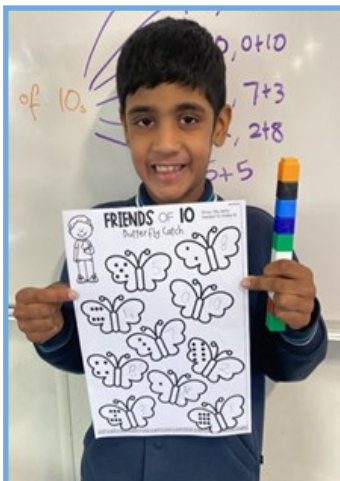
YEAR TWO

This week in Year Two, our learners have been busy exploring different Science based jobs, as part of our Inquiry unit. MUSIC AND PERFORMING ARTS

Our Prep students have been immersing themselves in the world of dynamics, learning about loud and soft sounds in music. Through interactive activities and hands-on experiences, they are developing a deeper understanding of how volume can convey different emotions in music.

Year One students have been preparing for an exciting class song performance. With dedication and enthusiasm, they have been practising their vocals and choreography, ready to showcase their talents on stage.

In Year Two, students have been engaging in fun rhythm card games to enhance their rhythmic skills. Through these interactive games, they are mastering the art of rhythm notation and developing a strong sense of timing and coordination. Introducing a new rhythm to their repertoire.

Year Three students are learning about the dotted minim (too-oo-oo). They are also exploring the keyboard, using their right hand to play melodies and familiarise themselves with musical notation.

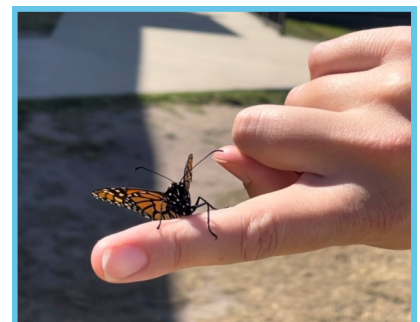
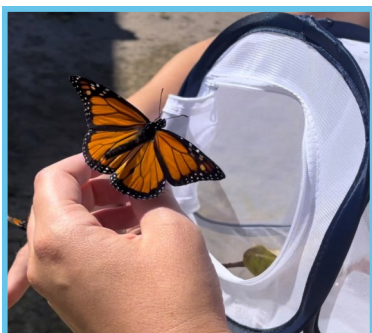
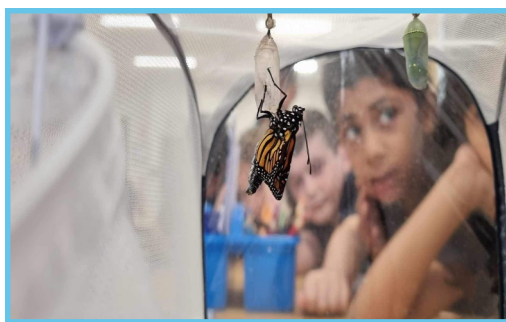
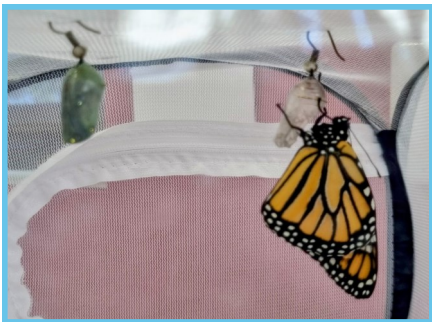
VISUAL ARTS

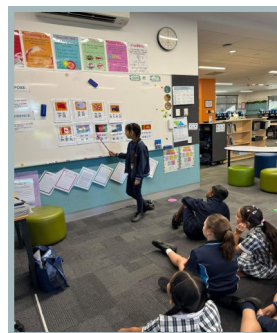
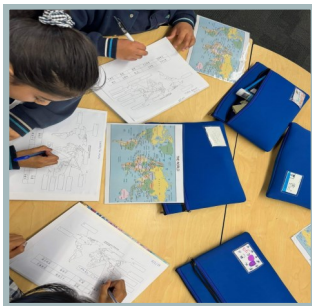
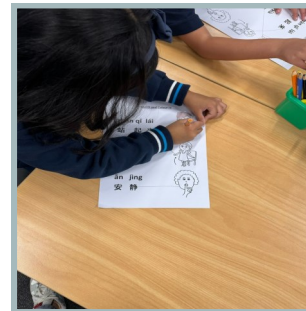

MANDARIN

Last week in Mandarin, the Prep and Year One students learned how to express their emotions in a full sentence in Mandarin and completed their assessments. 
