VISUAL ARTS

Our students in Art have been busy finishing off their final details for their Art project for Term One. The Prep students have constructed their amazing three-dimensional dragons. The Year One and Two students have started to construct their Dragon Masks. Our Year Three and Fours have worked very hard in putting together their dragon shields, outstanding work! The Year Fives have been using their modelling and painting skills in the final construction of their three dimensional dragon eyes. Our Year Six students have started on the first stages of their Art projects, focusing on self expression and emphasis. What an exciting Term we have had and it was amazing to see the wide range of creativity our talented Tulliallan students were able to showcase throughout their 'Year of the Dragon' study.



STEM

To finish up our Biological Science unit this term, our Year Prep students learned about different things that animals need to survive. They did this by replicating the chicken enclosure earlier in the Term, showing that chickens need food, water, and a warm shelter.













Our Year One and Two students wrapped up their learning by observing the stages that take place within the lifecycle of a bean. Students replicated the story 'Jack and the Beanstalk' by coloring in a giant's castle and attaching this to a small dirt cup after they had planted their beans.



MUSIC AND PERFORMING ARTS

We're thrilled to share the exciting highlights from our music program wrapping up an exciting term. Prep students are exploring tempo, discovering how the speed of music affects its mood and feel. Our One students are showcasing their class song performances. Ostinato rhythms are taking centre stage in Two! Students are learning to create ostinato patterns that add depth and texture to their music, building their rhythmic prowess one beat at a time. It's all about the keyboard in Three! Students are mastering the notes and techniques needed to play melodies with their right hand. Our Five students are ready to take the stage with their performances! They're putting their hard work and dedication into practice as they prepare to showcase their talents to the class. We're incredibly proud of all our students this Term for their enthusiasm and dedication.

MANDARIN

We are almost at the end of the term. Well done to all year levels for finishing up their Mandarin assessment last week. We were really glad to see most of the Prep students were able to introduce themselves in Mandarin and respond to most of the classroom phrases. The Year One and Two students showed their enthusiasm in the revision of the topics of emotions. It is great to see the Year Three to Four students remembering and recalling most of the countries in Mandarin. The Year Five and Six students started their research about Mandarin speaking countries. Most of them already had some interesting findings and are ready to present it next term. They also had an opportunity to play the Blooket to revise all the countries and languages that they learned this term. All the year levels are also exposed to a range of activities for celebrating Easter including colouring in and handcraft. The Language and Culture Club last week introduced the countries of South Korea. Students were exposed to history and learned the basic greetings "Hello, Thank you and Sorry" in Korean.




