PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

OFFICIAL OPENING OF KOWAN RECREATION RESERVE AND SPORTING FIELDS

Last night the official opening of Kowan Sporting Fields adjacent to Tulliallan PS was held. The Casey Council along with the Bunurong Land Council Aboriginal Corporation suggested three names for the recreation reserve of which the community voted for Kowan meaning Echidna. Representatives of the community were invited such as the Cranbourne United Soccer Club and Eastern Rebels Cricket Club, that have Kowan as their club headquarters and home ground, Rebecca Highland from the Tulliallan Recreation Reserve Community Action Group, who rallied the community and liaised with the Casey Council to ensure the sporting fields space was protected from residential development for our community. In addition, our School Council President, Libby, and I were invited. Nolene Duff is the Chair of Administrators for the City of Casey and she spoke of the significance of the sculpture and it's relevance to sport. We are grateful that we have this amazing facility next to our school for school use as well as for our students and families to enjoy active time after school.

Today we are going to talk about a book called 'The Dry Village'.

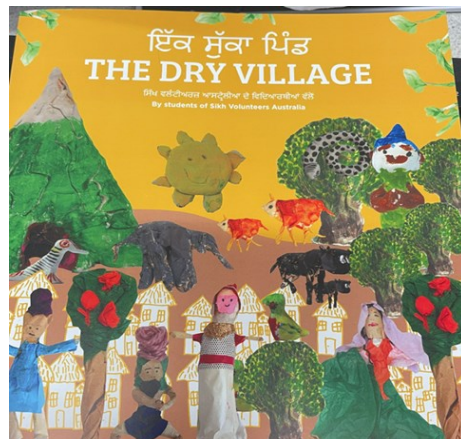
About the Book

MUSIC AND PERFORMING ARTS

Our Year One and Two students have been using tuned instruments such as the glockenspiels to learn about pitch and melody. The Year Three's have been learning how to rhyme to a three beat rhythm pattern. This week the Year Four students have been learning about script writing. They have collaborated enthusiastically with one another to decide on a setting, characters and a theme, in order to create a short play. Students have experimented with the details of their characters voice and persona and have begun thinking about possible story lines to keep their audience engaged. It is always great to see our students work so well with one another in a creative space. Well done Year Four! Year Five and Six have continued to practise chord progressions on tuned instruments and it has been wonderful to see students discover what their favourite instrument is to play during these sessions. We announced to our choir the exciting news about performing at this year's production and we have some very excited singers ready to make this performance one to remember! The school band has been working on the song Lanterns and have been using their student voice to help choose songs for their future repertoire.

MANDARIN

Can you count in Mandarin? As of this week, the answer is yes for all our Tulliallan students including Preps. Last week in Mandarin, the Prep students consolidated their knowledge of numbers 1-10 after two weeks of learning. They also practised writing these numbers in Chinese characters. Years One and Two revised 8 to 10 types of pets and farm animals using gestures, before learning the sentence structure “我有 (I have) ...+ animals.” The Year Three and Four students continued revising numbers 1 to 31, and integrated this knowledge in expressing days of the week, months and dates in Mandarin. They can now follow the pattern to translate their birthday and all 365 days of the year in Mandarin! Year Five and Six students continued to present their project on a country with a Mandarin-speaking population to their class. What an exciting time to be able to showcase research and learning! The Mandarin teachers were impressed with the slides containing extensive information and engaging visuals, as well as students who spoke Mandarin with near perfect pronunciations. The Language and Culture Club ran as usual. We had Year Four students demonstrate a Bollywood dance, all students who participated had a great time singing and dancing along.
