PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

CURRICULUM DAY YESTERDAY

The Curriculum Day was very productive yesterday with teams meeting to have professional learning in the Victorian Curriculum and summative and formative assessments. We revised our whole school documentation for consistency across year levels and in specialist areas, in preparation for Semester Two and beyond. In addition, professional learning around similarities and differences for the new ACARA English and Mathematics 2.0 curriculum, which is to be fully implemented for 2025, was conducted in teams. Our Educational Support staff worked in their year levels with teachers about making adjustments to curriculum to suit the needs of the students they work with. In addition, the ES had a professional learning session with our wellbeing leaders, Mrs Chan and Ms Cleary on specific strategies on how to make adjustments to support students with behavioural and academic needs, as well as professional learning around trauma informed practices and mental health in primary schools.

2025 PREP INFORMATION SESSION, TOUR AND ENROLMENT - TUESDAY 18 JUNE

Next week we are holding our second session and tour on Tuesday 18th of June. Session 1 is at 3.30pm and Session 2 is at 4pm. Parents will be able to book on COMPASS. Our school is on a strict Enrolment Management Plan, stating as per Department of Education Policy, that we only accept enrolments from families who have a sibling attending TPS that same year or proof of residency they live within our school zone. Over the 8 years we have had three zone reductions to ease pressure on the school. Please contact our school office for an enrolment form. Parents need to check that they are in our school zone. Proof of address verification is required on enrolment. Parents can identify their local public school online at <https://www.findmyschool.vic.gov.au/>, remember to tick 2025 and this shows every school zone across the state.

STUDENT LED CONFERENCE DAY/EVENING – WEDNESDAY 26 JUNE STUDENTS ATTEND SCHOOL FOR THE CONFERENCE ONLY

The Semester One reports will be released to parents via COMPASS on the 21st of June. The first semester is not a full six months for the June report, as students have been at school for approximately four and a half months by the time reports are written. The June report will reflect their first semester learning and areas for improvement for second semester. The most important part of student learning is the ability for students to lead their conference with their parents and teachers to talk about what they have learnt and their learning goals on Wednesday 26th of June. Students only come to school for their conference time on the 26th of June. Parents are able to book a student led conference time on COMPASS.

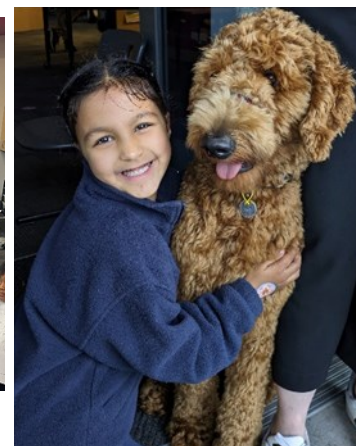
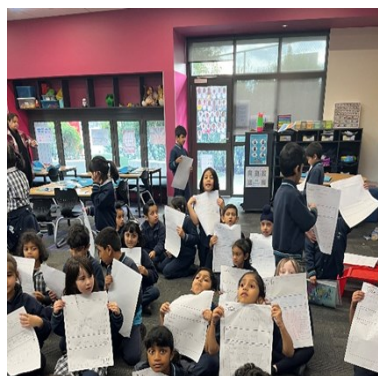
PREP

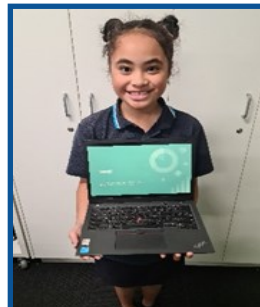
YEAR TWO

YEAR THREE

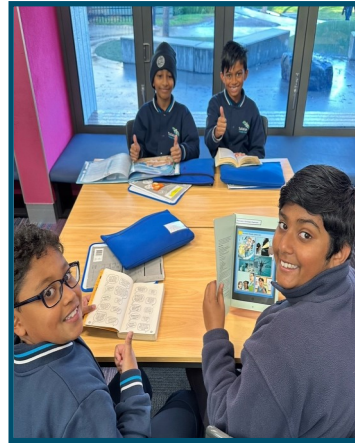

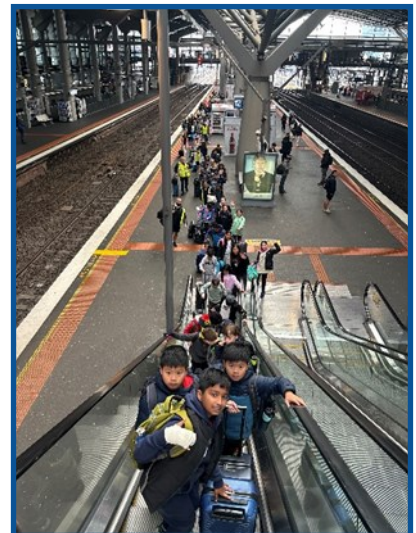
YEAR FOUR

YEAR FIVE

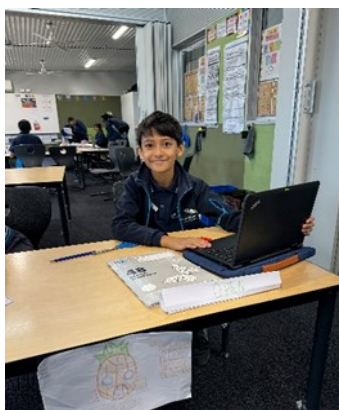

YEAR SIX

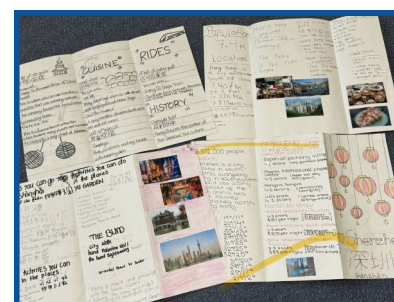
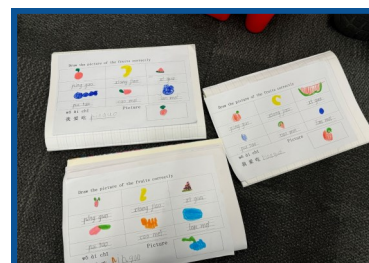

MANDARIN

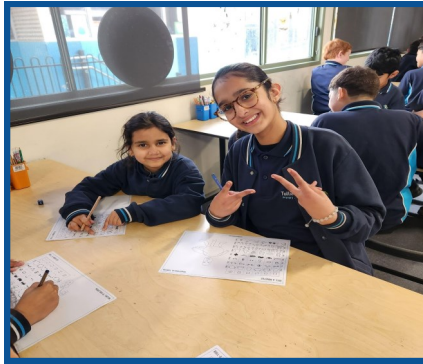
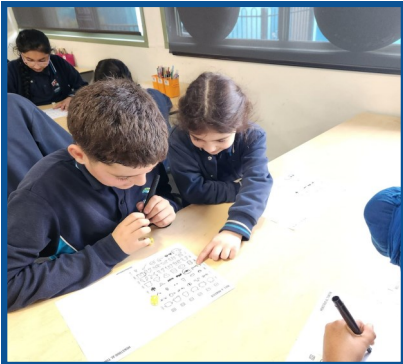

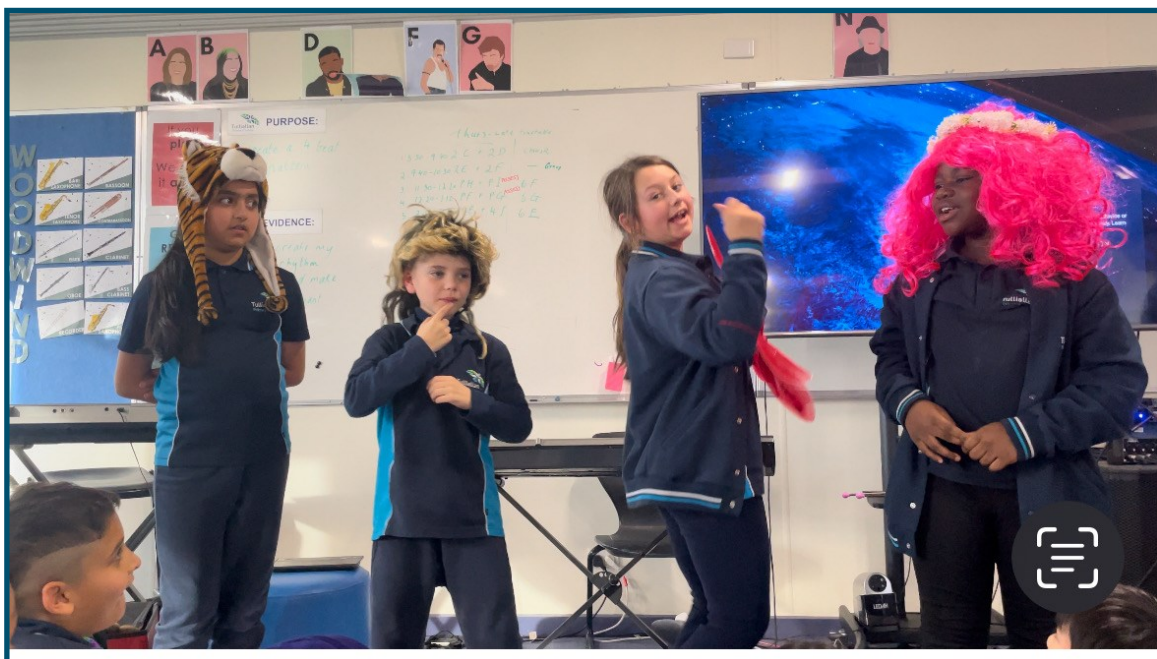
VISUAL ARTS
