2026 PEER MEDIATION

Our Year Five and Six Peer Mediators were part of a workshop facilitated by 'Stride Education' who provide them with the training and skills to become the Tulliallan Peer Mediators for 2026. In training they focused on understanding the role and the positive impact Peer Mediators can have on our school community.

The training consists of discussions, working collaboratively with each other, role playing, reading body language, the importance of compromise and learning to look at things through different lenses (being empathetic).

Peer Mediators can be approached by students needing help. There are six steps they need to follow but at any time they feel unsafe or unsure they are to approach a teacher on yard duty for assistance. The six steps are:

- **Agree to mediate** – where they introduce themselves, ask if students need help and explain what is expected.
- **Find out what the problem is** – by giving everyone a voice, listening and being empathetic.
- **Find out what each person wants** – by asking what outcome each person is hoping for.
- **Finding Solutions** – assist in finding a solution.
- **Choose the best idea** – make sure that all parties are involved in the solution chosen.
- **Create an agreement** – make sure that all parties are happy and in agreement.

When you see our Peer Mediators hard at work, wearing their blue vests in the yard go and introduce yourself by saying hello.

All members of the Tulliallan Primary School community (Students, Families/Carers and Staff) are invited to take part in our weekly Walking School Bus Program.

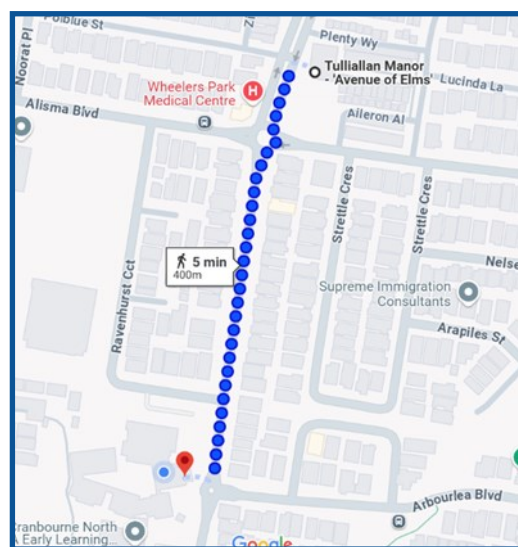
What is the *Walking School Bus*?

YEAR ONE

In Math's, we have been focusing on looking closely for number patterns to identify and explain missing numbers.

In Integrated Learning, we have been learning about the importance of a diverse community. Students have thoughtfully discussed the value of having different characteristics, perspectives and strengths, and how these differences enrich our community.

We continued to dive deep into the chapters in the book 'Matilda' to answer the literal, inferential and evaluative questions in Literacy. We also made self to text connections to develop further understanding of the text and to appreciate the caring and nurturing learning environment we thrive in.

In our Writing, we expanded sentences to add details and continued to complete our resolution and conclusion paragraphs for our narrative writing.

In Maths, we also explored more on addition and subtraction, finding out the extended fact families and using bar model, partitioning and number line strategies to solve problems.

We went through the whole cycle of NAPLAN writing including planning, writing and revising. We treated it as a real test and gave it our best efforts. We also developed confidence in our skills of using technology by typing our narratives on our laptops. Well done Year Three, for all your efforts to complete Week Four successfully!

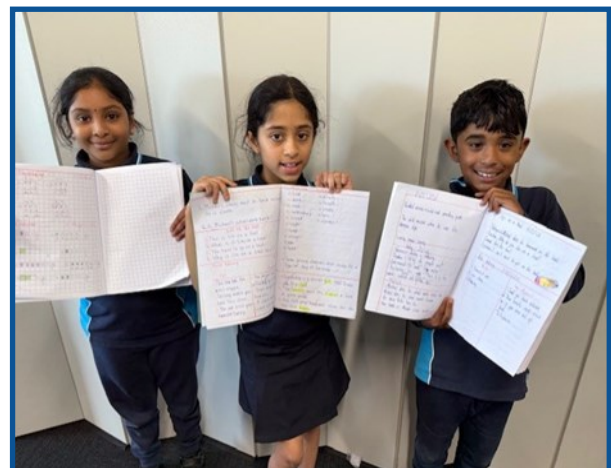


YEAR FOUR

This week, we have continued learning about fractions of shapes and collections; students have enjoyed finding the equal parts in irregular shapes.

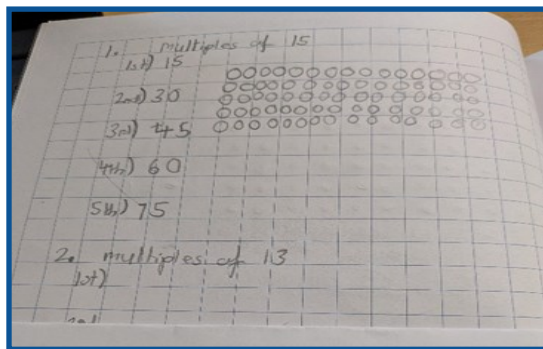
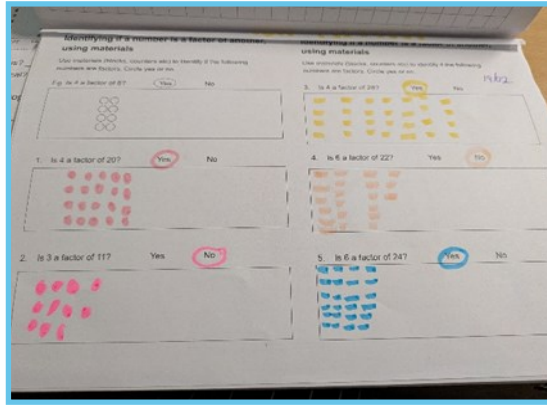
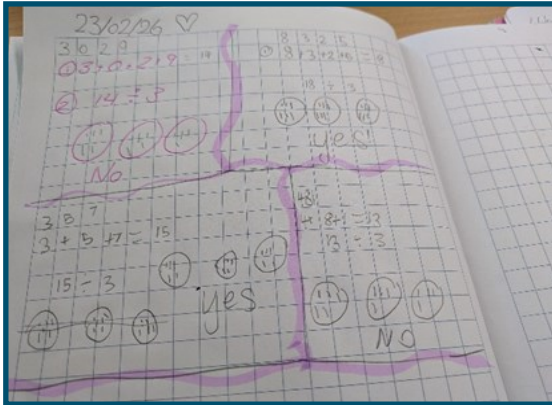

The Year Five and Six students have done really well learning the guitar. It has been great to see those who have persisted when learning and transitioning between chords such as E, C and G.

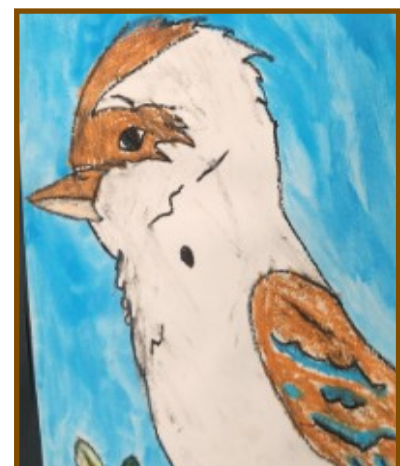
Year Four students have been working on their Drama unit and learning all about script writing and voice projection and it has been great to watch our students perform with such enthusiasm.

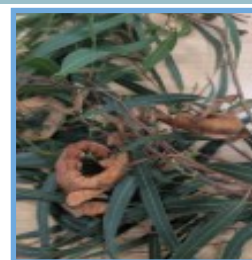
Year One and Two students created their own version of birds, using texture rubbings with crayon and fluoro watercolours, to create some wonderful pieces.

STEM

Prep, Year One, and Year Two students enjoyed a very special visit from some colourful new friends this week - Monarch butterflies! As part of our learning about how living things grow and change, students had the opportunity to observe the butterflies up close inside a special butterfly gazebo. In small groups, students entered the enclosure and used long sticks to gently hold the butterflies. As everyone became more confident, the butterflies began landing on hands, arms, shoulders, and even heads! It was a magical experience filled with excitement, curiosity, and lots of big smiles.



Students then explored the fascinating life cycle of a butterfly. They learned that butterflies begin as tiny eggs laid on the underside of leaves. From these eggs hatch hungry caterpillars that eat and grow, shedding their skin several times along the way. When fully grown, the caterpillar transforms into a chrysalis, where it stays safely tucked away until it emerges as a beautiful butterfly. We also discovered that while most butterflies live for only about two weeks, those that hibernate can survive for several months.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Our students have been full of energy in P.E. this term. Years Three to Six have been busy preparing for our upcoming Athletics Day in Week 10, developing their skills across all areas including high jump, triple jump, shot put and discus. Their enthusiasm and determination have been fantastic to see as they build confidence and refine their techniques.

Meanwhile, our Prep to Year Two students have been focusing on strengthening their fundamental motor skills. Through fun, engaging activities, they've been practising skills such as hopping, catching, throwing, and movement patterns that set the foundation for future physical learning.

It's been a wonderful start to the term, and we're proud of the effort and progress shown by all students.

IMPORTANT REMINDER:

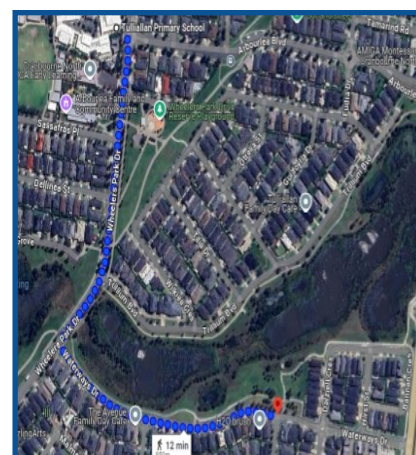

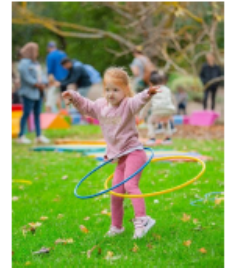
