The school does not take any money for the photos it all must be ordered through SchoolPix.

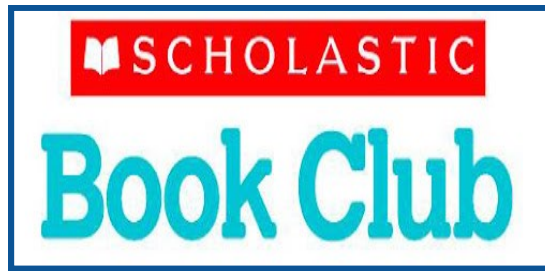
**Mr Moin's and Mr Guscott's** photos will be taken on Monday March 23<sup>rd</sup>, not Friday March 20<sup>th</sup>.

Students have explored a range of short traditional stories where animal characters talk and act like people, facing problems and making choices that reveal important life lessons. We are also continuing to build on students' grammar knowledge by introducing them to adjectives to help make their writing more interesting.

In Mathematics, we have used hands on materials to aide in building students place value knowledge by partitioning numbers into 'tens' and 'ones'.

Well done, Year Ones, on another wonderful week of learning!

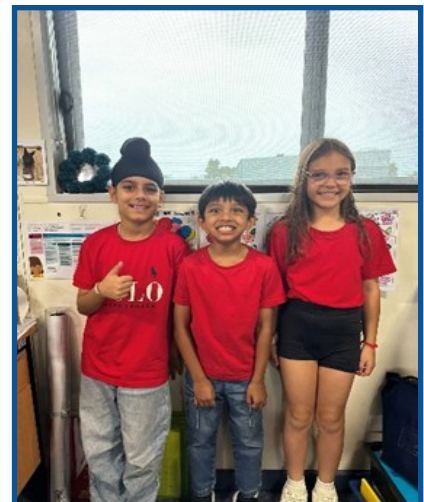


## YEAR TWO

What a fantastic week this has been! Year Two students have worked extremely hard and celebrated just as hard! We had a wonderful time dressing up to celebrate the end of Chinese New Year and loved all the activities over the last few weeks.

Our English unit has moved on to a new text, and we are learning about the Tea and Sugar Train featured in our text 'The Shop Train'. The sentences the students are producing are fantastic, with lots of focus on who, what, where and when information.

Maths has seen the introduction of telling the time, as well as learning about quarter, half and three-quarter turns, both clockwise and anticlockwise. It has been a very full week of learning! What a wonderful effort Year Two Students.



# SCHOOL NEWS

## YEAR THREE

Year Three students enjoyed another busy and engaging week of learning. On Tuesday, students celebrated the Chinese New Year by wearing red, yellow, gold, or horse-themed outfits. It was wonderful to see students embracing the celebration and learning about this important cultural event.

On Friday, students participated in a Cyber Safety Incursion, where they learned to control their online activity, make safe decisions when using technology, and seek support from trusted adults if needed. It was great to see students actively engaging, collaborating, and sharing ideas about how to stay safe online.

In the classroom, students have been working hard across all learning areas.

In Literacy, we explored persuasive writing techniques, learning to clearly express their opinions and support them with strong reasons to convince readers.

In Mathematics, students focused on telling time, identifying hours, minutes, and seconds on both analogue and digital clocks. They also practised estimating elapsed time for different events and activities.

In Inquiry, students discussed the concept of consensus and explored how groups can work together to reach an agreement while considering everyone's ideas. Students also completed NAPLAN narrative writing practise by creating imaginative stories about a boat or ship. Well done, Year Three, for another fantastic week of learning!



## YEAR FOUR

This week in Mathematics we have been learning about time, figuring out how to calculate the number of hours between certain events in the day, crossing over AM and PM and discovering how to know the number of hours each activity took.

In English we have been writing our persuasive pieces about 'deforestation' and exploring arguments for and against.

In DigiTech we have learned about Cyber Safety and how to be responsible users of content online and understanding the impact that they have in their own digital footprint.

During Integrated Learning we have been discussing continents, oceans and countries and figuring out where each of them lie around the world.

Students are also embracing their classroom roles, demonstrating the value of responsibility by taking care of their environment in a helpful and positive way.

# SPECIALISTS

## MANDARIN

What a week for Mandarin students and teachers! Not only was last Tuesday the Lantern Festival, but it marked the conclusion of the 15-day Lunar New Year celebrations. Students and staff were invited to dress in red, yellow or horse-themed costumes. Neigh-less to say, they enjoyed galloping around all day.



Prep students were introduced to classroom instructional phrases including “站起来 stand up” “坐下 sit down” “安静 be quiet” and “很好 very good”. Paired with AIM gestures and through repetition and games, students began to remember and respond to the four phrases.

Year One and Two students continued exploring the story of the Chinese Zodiac. They revised the first eight animals before acquiring the vocabulary for the last four animals on the zodiac wheel: 猴 monkey, 鸡 rooster, 狗 dog and 猪 pig . Through AIM gestures, interactive games and matching tasks, students strengthened their pronunciation and recall while deepening their understanding of the zodiac story.



In Year Three and Four, students acquired vocabulary related to countries including “国 country” “澳大利亚 Australia” “美国 the US” “中国 China” and “印度 India”. To build their listening, speaking and reading skills, students played games such as “N+1/N-1” and “Four Corners”.



Our Year Five and Six students began learning how to say the days of the week in Mandarin “星期一, 星期二, 星期三, 星期四, 星期五, 星期六, 星期日”. They played a competitive game using the wheel of names, before continuing to complete the days of the week in their Mandarin calendars, applying their new vocabulary in a meaningful context. We look forward to seeing their completed calendars in the coming weeks.

## VISUAL ARTS

This week in Visual Arts, the Year Five and Six students have been applying their watercolour painting skills to their Year of the Horse artwork. Students are adding metallic paint as a finishing touch to their steampunk style horse illustration. The Year One, Two, Three and Four students are revising the Elements of Art this week. They are further developing their understanding of colour, shape, line, texture, form, space and value and how they can incorporate these elements into their drawings.

Prep students have completed their Lunar New Year horse artwork and are now learning about the art element of line. They have practised drawing different types of lines including straight, zigzag, wavy, dotted and curly.

# SPECIALISTS

## STEM

Year Three and Four students have been learning how producers, consumers and decomposers each play an important role in keeping an ecosystem healthy. To build on this, students were introduced to new scientific vocabulary to help them describe how living things interact.

Through hands on STEM activities, students explored how producers (plants) make their own food, how consumers rely on eating plants or other animals for energy and how decomposers break down dead material to return nutrients to the soil. They then used this knowledge to build simple food chains, showing how energy moves from one organism to another.

Students also learned about primary, secondary and tertiary consumers and discovered how apex predators sit at the very top of a food chain. They investigated predator and prey relationships and used the terms herbivore, carnivore and omnivore to classify different animals based on what they eat.

It's been wonderful to see students thinking like young scientists—asking questions, making connections and modelling how living things depend on each other in an ecosystem.



## MUSIC

This week in Music and Performing Arts, Prep students explored the concept of beat, demonstrating their understanding of the word and how it applies in music activities.

Year One students improvised simple movements to a steady beat, developing their sense of rhythm and coordination.

In Year Two, students continued their composition unit using xylophones, glockenspiels and percussion, bringing together the skills they have been practising to perform their pieces.

Year Three students worked with percussion circles, exploring rhythm, dynamics and musical interaction through a rhythmic loop game.

Year Four students explored choreography and improvisation, using song lyrics to inspire creative movement and dance ideas.

In Years Five and Six, students continued their “Everyone Can Play” instrumental program, developing keyboard skills and building confidence performing simple musical patterns.

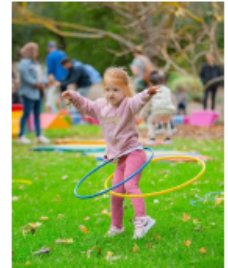
