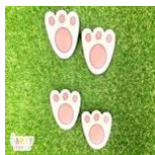


TUESDAY 24th OF MARCH STOP WORK

As parents and carers may be aware, staff at our school who are Australian Education Union (AEU) members have been negotiating, alongside teachers, education support staff, assistant principals, and principals from public schools around Victoria, with the State Government and Department of Education for full funding for each student, improvements to employment conditions and fair pay in line with other educators around Australia. The current VSGA agreement has expired. Negotiations have been occurring over the last seven months for the next agreement. AEU members have the aim of ensuring the retention of existing employees and the attraction of the next generation to enable the ongoing provision of a high-quality education to students. AEU members are taking stop work action in a statewide 24-hour stop work for Tuesday 24 March. The decision to stop work has not been taken lightly and Tulliallan Staff acknowledge the inconvenience this may cause families on the day. Tulliallan parents have always supported the hard-working staff at Tulliallan in the good times and tough times and we hope the community understand and supports our members for the reasons outlined above. Last week, we closely monitored student punctuality and early departures across the school. While it's great to see so many students arriving ready for learning, we are still noticing a consistent number of late arrivals and early pick-ups each day.

Across the week:

- Late arrivals ranged from **45–59 students per day**
- Early departures ranged from **22–30 students per day**

While individual occasions may seem minor, these interruptions quickly add up. Missing even 10–15 minutes at the start or end of the day can mean lost learning time, disrupted routines, and missed important instructions or connections with peers. We also noticed that late arrivals and early departures are spread across all year levels, highlighting that this is a whole-school focus.

Why this matters:

- The first part of the day is critical for setting up learning
- Students arriving late can feel unsettled and miss key literacy/numeracy blocks
- Early departures interrupt both your child's learning and the class environment

How families can help:

- Aim to arrive **before the bell each morning**
- Schedule appointments outside of school hours where possible
- Communicate with the school if there are ongoing challenges—we're here to support

Improving attendance is a shared responsibility, and even small changes can make a big difference. Thank you for your continued support in ensuring every child has the best opportunity to succeed.

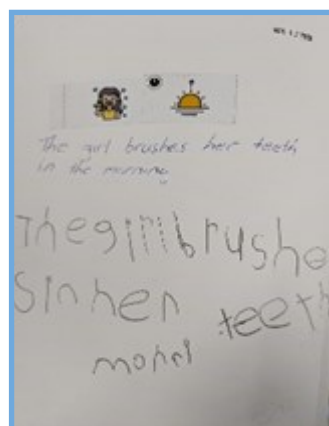
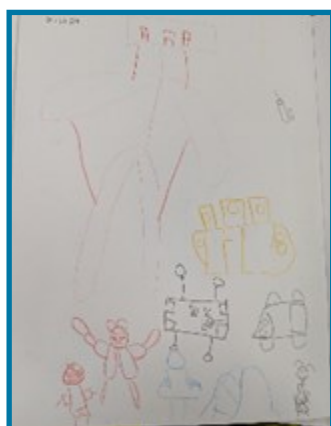
SCHOOL NEWS

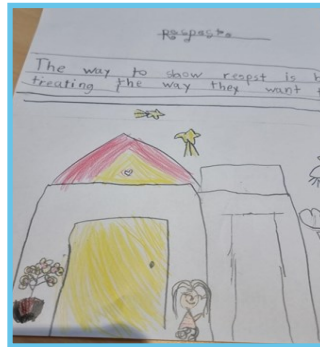
YEAR ONE

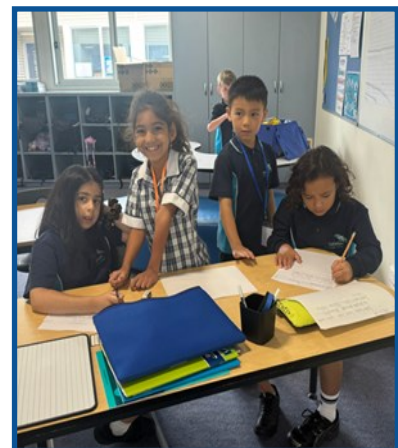


YEAR TWO

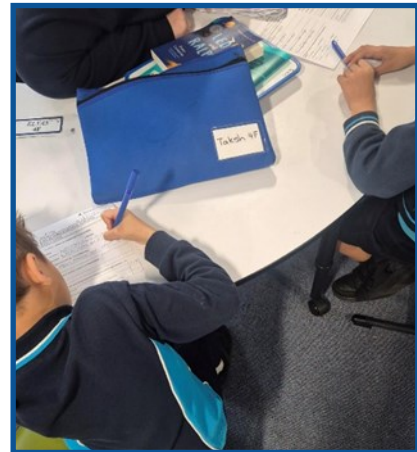
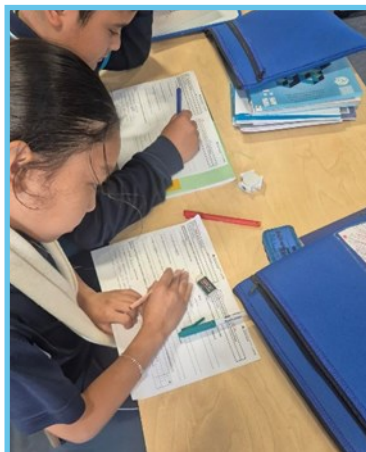


YEAR FOUR

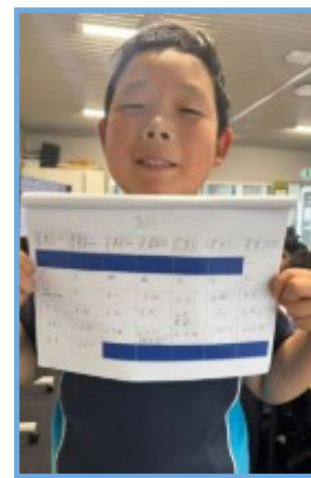
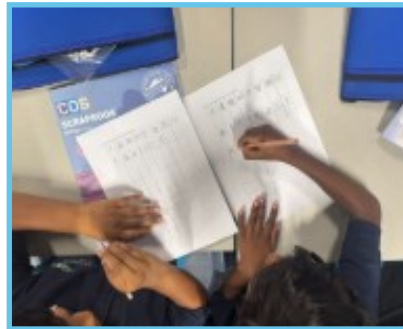
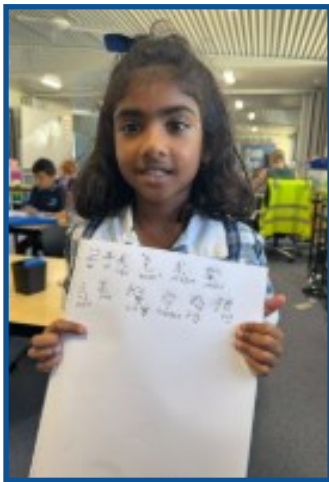
MANDARIN

STEM

Prep students have been learning about the different parts of a plant and the important roles these parts play in helping plants grow and survive. As part of their STEM lessons, students were introduced to key plant parts including roots, seeds, stems, leaves and flowers and began exploring their different features.

Through hands-on investigation, students carefully observed real plant samples and used magnifying glasses and handheld microscopes to look closely at the details of each plant part. This allowed them to notice patterns, textures and shapes that are often difficult to see with the naked eye.

To further develop their observation skills, students also completed a leaf tracing activity. They carefully traced the shapes and veins of different leaves, helping them notice how leaves can vary in size, shape and patterns.

It has been wonderful to see our young learners using scientific tools, asking questions and developing their observation skills as they begin to think and work like scientists.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

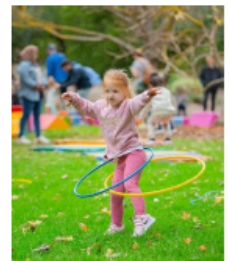

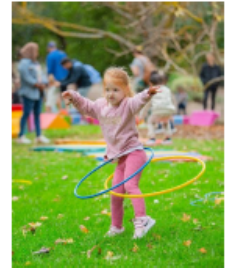
