Well done on a fantastic Term One, Preps!

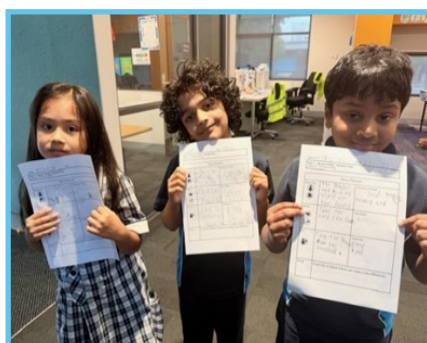
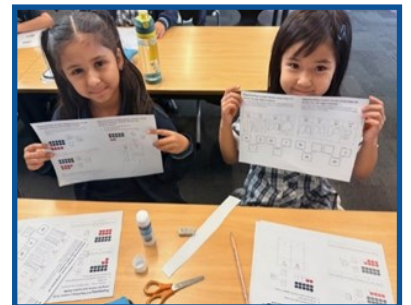


YEAR ONE

We wish everyone a safe and exciting holidays and can't wait to see you all back in Term Two!



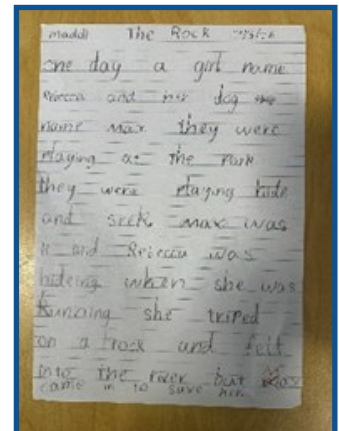
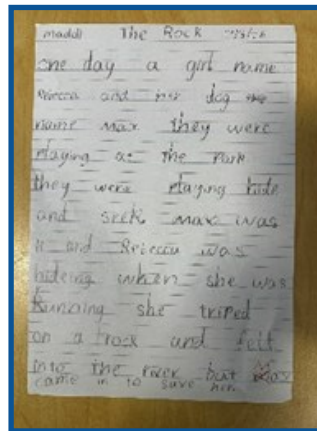
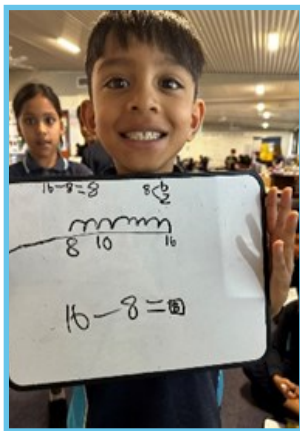
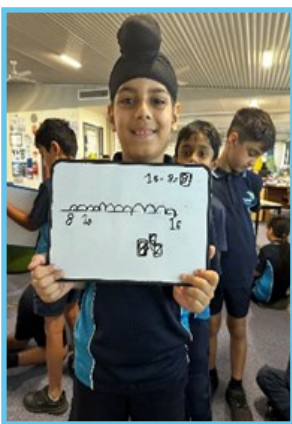
SCHOOL NEWS

With the holidays approaching, the Year Four Team wish everyone a safe, restful and enjoyable holiday break.

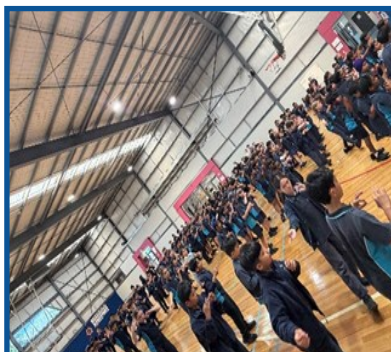
YEAR FIVE

It has been great to see the enthusiasm and engagement of our Year Five students across all areas of learning this term.

Last week, students had the exciting opportunity to participate in a dance workshop, Footsteps. Students thoroughly enjoyed expressing themselves through movement while developing coordination, rhythm and confidence to the Indian dance routines.

In Maths, students have been exploring how to measure both area and perimeter. We have been working with regular and irregular shapes, learning how to calculate and compare measurements. Students have been understanding and explaining how something happens in their Explanation report writing. They have been developing their ability to use the correct structure and include appropriate vocabulary to explain the processes. This has supported their writing and comprehension skills.

YEAR SIX

Term One Integrated Learning Unit saw the Year Six students develop some wonderful projects about their family history, culture and traditions. We were inspired by our novel study, 'A Ghost in my Suitcase,' in English. During our unit we learnt about the importance of understanding your family history and how cultural heritage, traditions, values, beliefs, family journeys, challenges, skills and talents are all passed down.



SPECIALISTS

MANDARIN

Term One has been massive for Mandarin, and we sure have a lot to celebrate!

All year levels spent the first four weeks of term developing their cultural awareness about Lunar New Year, participating in activities such as singing and dancing, games, colouring in, hand craft, brush-pen writing, lantern riddles and dumpling making.



Prep students eased into the school routine by familiarising themselves with classroom instructional phrases in Mandarin.

Year One and Two students have been deepening their understanding of the zodiac race including the story, the animals and the order in which they came up in the race. They participated in role play utilising simple sentences in Mandarin and their DIY masks.



Years Three and Four students acquired vocabulary for countries and are able to ask and answer questions about their nationality.

Years Five and Six students utilised their knowledge about months, dates and days of the week to create a 2026 Year of the Horse calendar that they will now be able to use for the rest of the year.

VISUAL ARTS

Prep students have been learning about different lines and practising their drawing skills, completing their colourful neon rabbit artworks.

Year One and Year Two students have explored the materials of paper, paint, pastel and paper clay as they have created their Year of the Horse artworks, while the Year Three to Year Six students have explored paint application techniques this term.

MUSIC

This week in Music and Performing Arts, Prep students consolidated their understanding of key musical elements through games, movement and simple performances. Demonstrating skills in sound and silence, dynamics, tempo, pitch, and rhythm patterns.

Year One students revised beat and rhythm through clapping, singing, movement and instrument play, showing their ability to keep a steady beat and distinguish between beat and rhythm.

Year Two students explored how to listen to music and represent their ideas visually by drawing how the music makes them feel.

Year Three students applied their learning by either creating group polyrhythms or using music apps to compose their own pieces, demonstrating creativity and collaboration.

Year Four students developed their confidence and coordination by performing a hip hop dance, while Year Five and Six students learned to sing and play a song about Corroboree, deepening their understanding of this important Australian Aboriginal cultural tradition.

STEM

This term in STEM, our learning focus was Biology and students across all year levels explored the living world with curiosity and enthusiasm. From observing tiny details through microscopes to discovering how environments shape living things, it's been a hands on and memorable start to the year.
