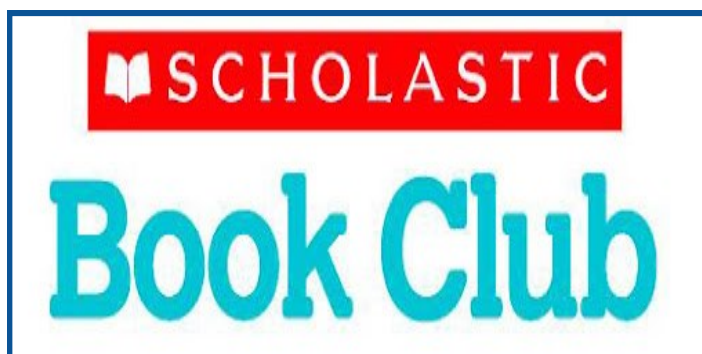

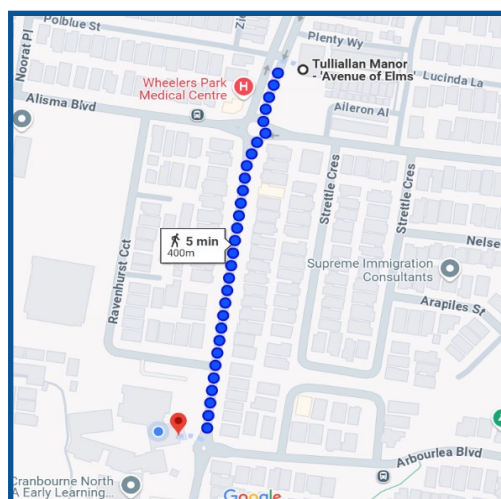
Meeting Time:

YEAR ONE

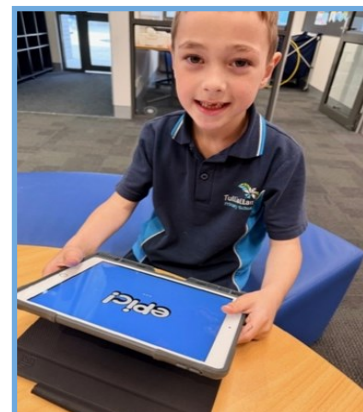
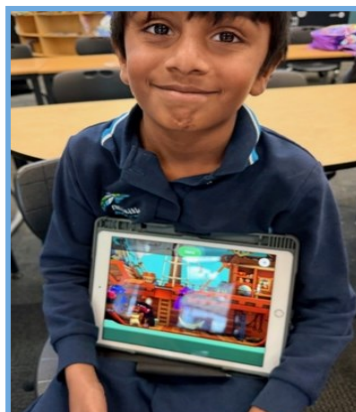
Welcome back to our Year One students and families. We have had a wonderful first week back and are so proud of how the students followed the routines and structures of the Learning Community.

In Phonics, we have been focusing on the 'oa' sound as in 'boat' by reading, writing and decoding words with this sound in it. Students have also been looking at the suffix 'er' and how it adds meaning to its base word.

In Writing, we have been exploring a new text 'Iggy Peck: Architect' where students have continued to develop their vocabulary. The Year One Students have been responding to this text by using it to develop their own statements and questions about the text. We have also been exploring this text during Integrated Learning where they have become architects by designing their own structure and identifying the materials they will need, like the characters in the story.

We have been working hard in Maths as we have continued to develop our understanding of partitioning by splitting a 2- digit number into 2 different parts (e.g. $41=20+21$). Students have also been developing their ability to recognise a number written by matching a numeral to the written word (e.g. $31=$ thirty-one).

We are so proud of how well the Year Ones have transitioned back into school and their learning. We are looking forward to another terrific term!

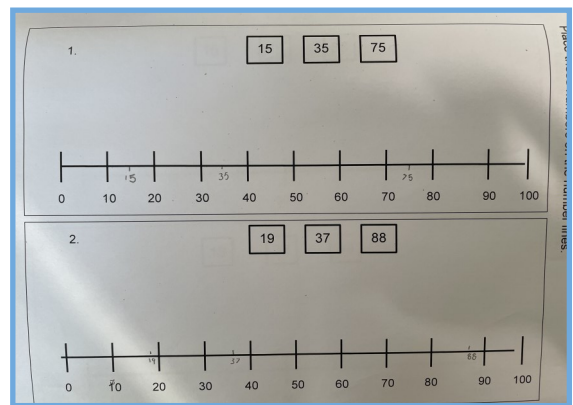
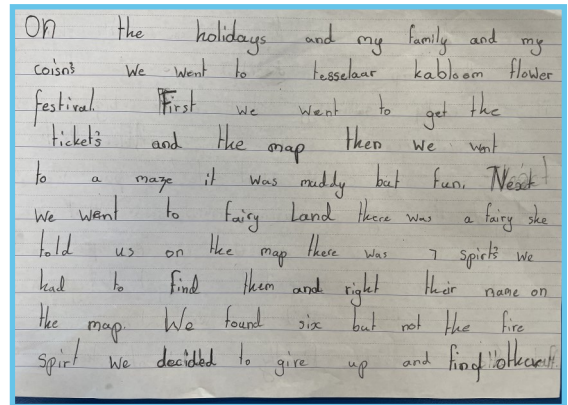
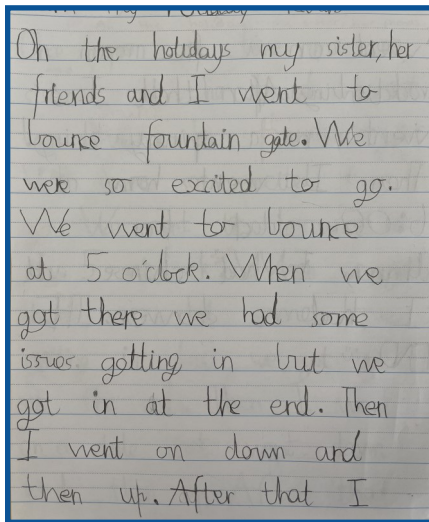


SCHOOL NEWS

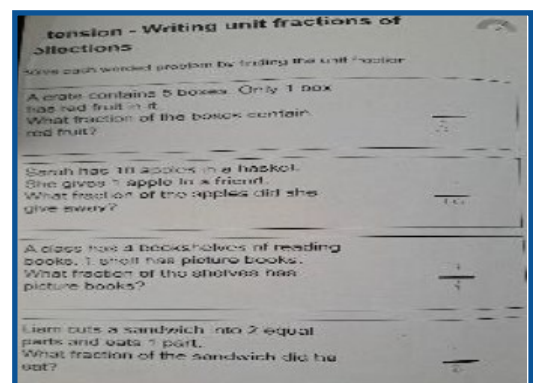
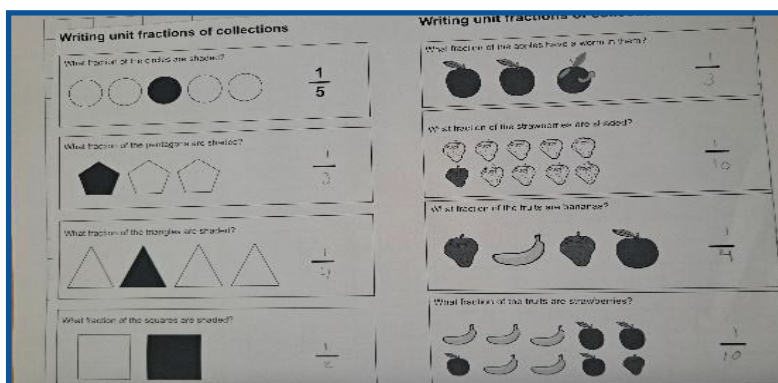


YEAR THREE

YEAR FOUR

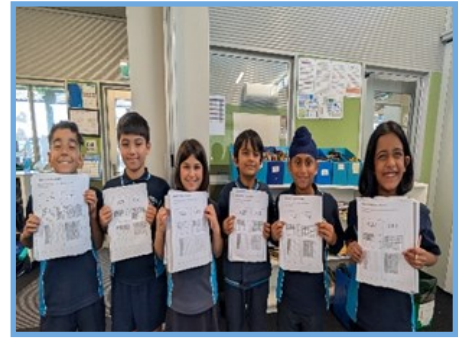
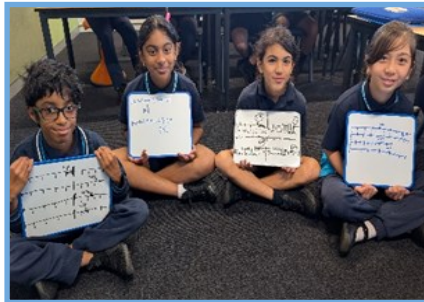
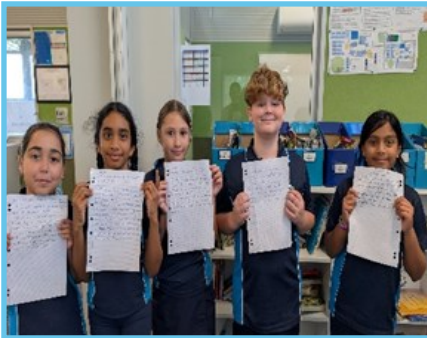
Welcome back to another exciting Term Year Four! It has been fantastic to see everyone return with a refreshed and ready-to-learn attitude.

Keep up the amazing work, Year Fours!

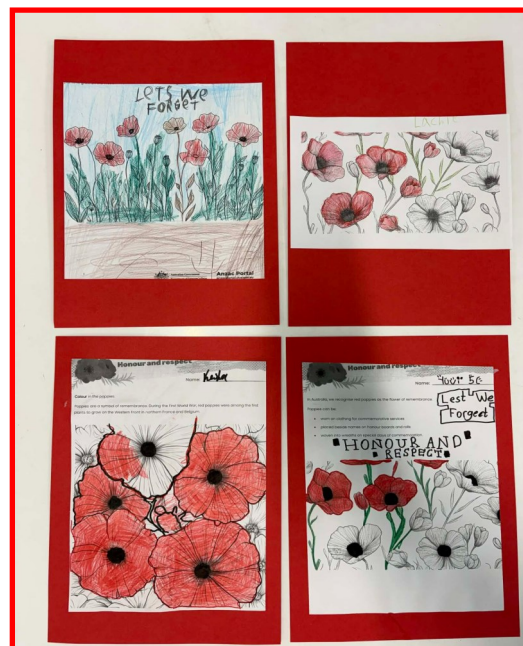


YEAR FIVE

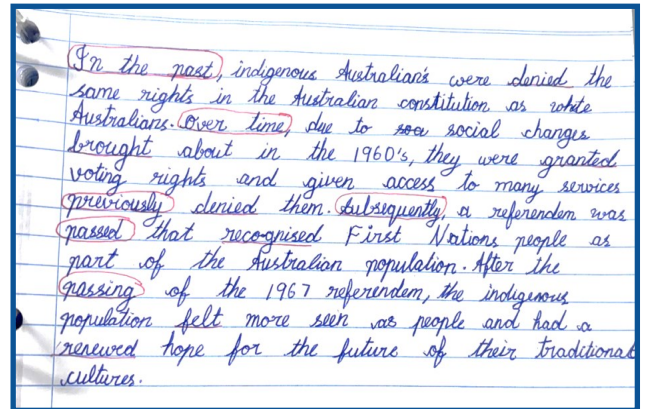
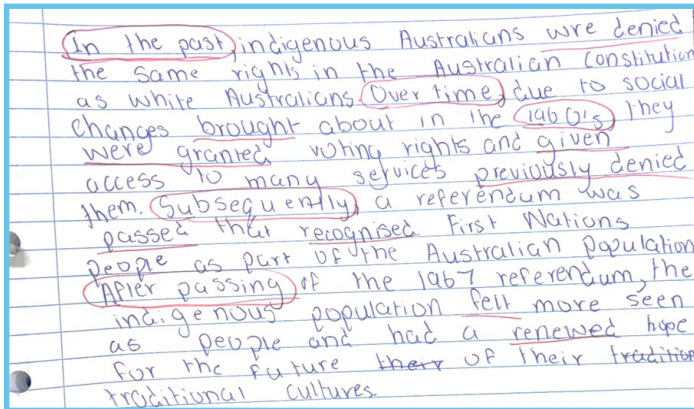
YEAR SIX

Term Two is off to a fantastic start, with our Year Six students jumping straight back into their learning!

In **English**, we have launched our new novel study, 'Us Mob Walawurru', and students have begun exploring the significance of the 1967 Referendum, which will form the basis of their factual recount writing.

In **Maths**, we have kicked off our fractions unit, where students are building confidence in comparing and ordering fractions.

In **Integrated Learning**, students have been investigating the world's continents, exploring the similarities and differences between each region and Australia.



SPECIALISTS

MANDARIN

What a wonderful start to Term Two in Mandarin! It has been a positive and engaging first week back, and has been wonderful to see students returning to Mandarin with enthusiasm and energy.

Prep students revised how to introduce themselves in Mandarin and practised simple self-introductions through fun games and activities. Using a range of cartoon characters, students enjoyed introducing themselves in creative ways while building confidence in speaking Mandarin aloud.

Year One and Two students revisited our classroom rules and practised useful Mandarin expressions for everyday classroom routines, and responded to simple classroom instructions. They also enjoyed revising the twelve Chinese Zodiac animals through interactive games, helping them recall key vocabulary from last term in a fun and engaging way.

In Year Three and Four, students reviewed stationery vocabulary such as 铅笔 pencil, 彩色笔 coloured pencils and 白板 whiteboard. Through speaking, matching and classroom-based activities, students strengthened their understanding of familiar words and continued building their confidence in using Mandarin in practical classroom contexts.

Years Five and Six began an exciting new project, creating a travel brochure. Students showed great interest as they started exploring Chinese cities and sharing what they already know about China. We look forward to seeing their creativity develop throughout this unit.

VISUAL ARTS

Welcome back everyone!

It has been an exciting start to Term Two in our Art spaces, as our students closely studied the significance and importance of ANZAC Day. Students from Prep to Year Two looked at creating a skyscape with chalk pastels and blending them to create a colourful design. Students also collaged paper poppies using coloured paper on top.

Year Three and Four students used their paper skills to create three-dimensional paper poppies with red and green coloured paper. Have a look at the amazing creativity our students have shown.



MUSIC

Well done to all of our amazing students for a great start to the term in Music classes.

Prep students have begun to learn the difference between rhythm and beat through a variety of body percussion and percussion exercises and songs.

Year One students are creating their own rhythm patterns with a focus on being able to play them along to a steady beat using a variety of beat values and at various tempos.

Year Two students are learning about music of other cultures and are learning to sing a traditional song of another culture.

Year Three students are developing their sense of melody using tuned percussion instruments, as well as keyboards to create and perform their own melody.

Year Four students are taking part in a special dance choreography unit where some of their movements and dance actions will be selected and used for their year level's Production songs.

Year Five and Six students have begun creating their own chord progressions and are also creating backing tracks using GarageBand. This is part of a broader approach to songwriting and they will end up with a short composition including verses and choruses.



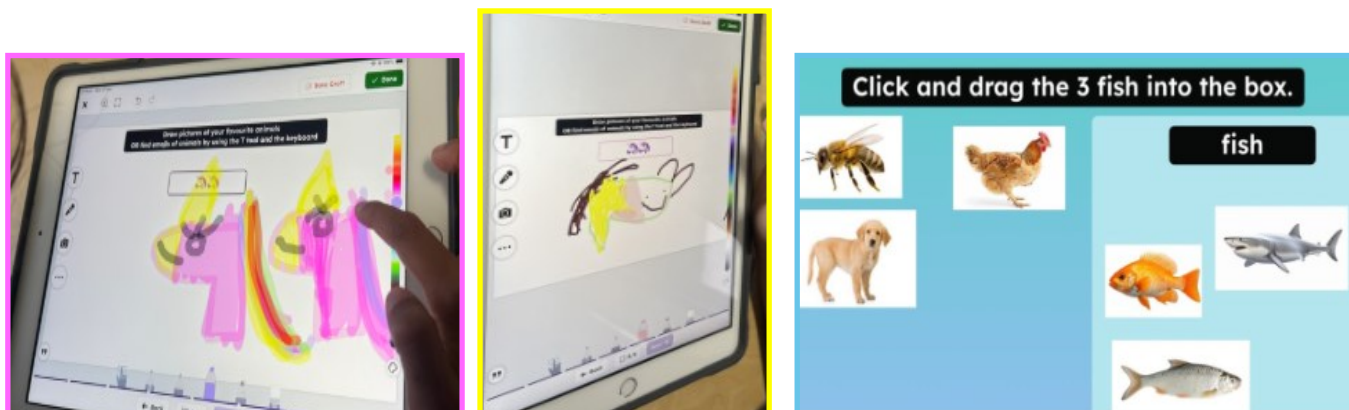
SPECIALISTS

It has been a busy and exciting week in STEM, with students across all year levels developing their digital skills, creativity, and problem-solving abilities through hands-on learning experiences.

Our youngest learners in Prep began their digital journey by learning how to confidently log in and out of Seesaw. They explored click and drag skills through a fun animal groups activity, showing great enthusiasm and independence.

Students in Year Two and Three worked with Scratch Jr to create animations. They designed a page with a road background, added vehicle sprites, and programmed them to move in different directions and speeds, even experimenting with costume changes. Students thoroughly enjoyed bringing their ideas to life and were excited to see their animations in action!
