At Tulliallan Primary School, we continue to emphasise the importance of students arriving at school on time and remaining at school for the full day wherever possible. Over the past week, we have seen a number of late arrivals and early departures across the school. For example, late arrivals ranged from 38–62 students on some days, with a particularly high number at the beginning of the week. While we understand that occasional lateness or appointments are sometimes unavoidable, arriving on time helps students settle into the day calmly, participate in important morning learning, and maintain strong routines. Similarly, avoiding early departures ensures students do not miss key learning opportunities, particularly in the afternoons when many classes consolidate the day's learning.

We encourage families to support their children in:

- Arriving at school before the bell each morning
- Planning appointments outside of school hours where possible
- Ensuring students stay for the full school day

Thank you to all families who continue to prioritise regular attendance and punctuality. It makes a significant difference to students' learning, wellbeing and sense of belonging at school.

YEAR THREE

This week in Year Three we have been looking at writing explanation texts. Students have been very interested and excited whilst reading our book 'Off we go around Australia. They have learnt about different places in Australia such as Bass Strait, Bogong Jack's Hut, Flinders Ranges, Coober Pedy, Great Barrier Reef, Daintree Rain Forest and Yellow Water in Kakadu. As we have been reading, we have also looked into some of the amazing Australian native Wildlife that can be found in some of these beautiful places like red kangaroo's, rock monitors, bilby's, Tasmanian devil's, jabiru's and dingoes just to name a few. Students have been very curious, asking lots of questions and enjoying the discussions.



Moving into Writing we are learning how to plan and write an explanation text about waterfalls. We have been reading different texts and looking at the process from rivers to waterfalls.



YEAR FOUR

In Year Four this week, we have been continuing to read 'Leo and Ralph', learning all about Leo's life and his adventures with his imaginary best friend Ralph! We have been working on our narratives as well, putting our creative writing to the test.

In Math's, we have been learning all about multiplication and division. We took a look at sequencing numbers, dividing and multiplying by ten and working with our doubling and halving strategies.

We also had the Footsteps incursion on Wednesday this week. Year Four students danced their hearts out, learning all different types of dances and performing them like champs!

This week has been busy but next week will be even bigger, see you for House Athletics!

YEAR FIVE

We had a wonderful celebration for Harmony Day. Many students dressed in traditional cultural clothing and proudly showcased their heritage. Students also enjoyed representing themselves through drawings of their unique cultural clothing.

In English, we have concluded our study of 'War Horse' through a persuasive writing unit. It has been great to see students developing their ability to organise their ideas using a clear structure, including topic sentences, three supporting points, and a conclusion.

During our Math's sessions, we have been extending our understanding of different ways to represent remainders, including decimals and fractions. We have also explored algebraic concepts by learning about the inverse relationship between multiplication and division.

Well done Year Fives for demonstrating your positive attitude throughout this term. Keep up the good work, IDOLS!



YEAR SIX

As part of our Harmony Day Celebrations, Year Six students participated in a dance workshop run by Ally from Footsteps Dance. Students learned a new routine with enthusiasm putting their best feet forward. It was great to see all the Year Sixes letting loose and having fun!



SPECIALISTS

MANDARIN

Across all year levels, students have been working on their assessments, demonstrating their learning in different ways, including speaking, writing and handcrafting tasks. Our Prep students have been building their confidence by learning and practising basic classroom routines such as standing up, sitting down, drinking water and so on. They became very familiar with the language and showed great enthusiasm during sessions.

Students in Year One and Two particularly enjoyed creating their animal masks and role play. It has been wonderful to see their creativity and excitement as they share their work with classmates.

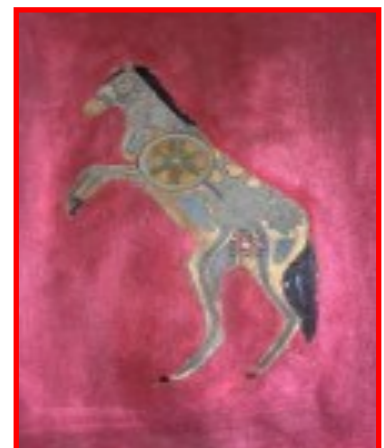
Year Three and Four students have been developing their speaking skills by practising sentence patterns confidently and engaging in short conversations with their peers.

Students in Year Five and Six have started decorating their own handmade calendars. As part of this task, they are incorporating Mandarin vocabulary related to dates, months and cultural elements. We are proud of all students for their efforts and look forward to continuing their learning journey.



VISUAL ARTS

Year Five and Six students have finished their Year of the Horse/steampunk artworks and they look fantastic. Students had to practise drawing horses, include mechanical elements into their horse and colour using metallic paints and pencils. Well done everyone!



SPECIALISTS

STEM

Year One and Two students have been learning that living things grow and change through different stages of a life cycle. In STEM, students explored the life cycle of a butterfly and discovered how it changes as it grows. Students learned about the four stages of a butterfly's life cycle: egg, caterpillar (larva), chrysalis (pupa) and butterfly (adult). They discussed how each stage looks different and how the butterfly changes over time. As part of a hands-on activity, students coloured, cut and sequenced the stages of the butterfly life cycle. They then glued the stages in the correct order onto a straw to create a moving model that helped them clearly see the sequence of changes.

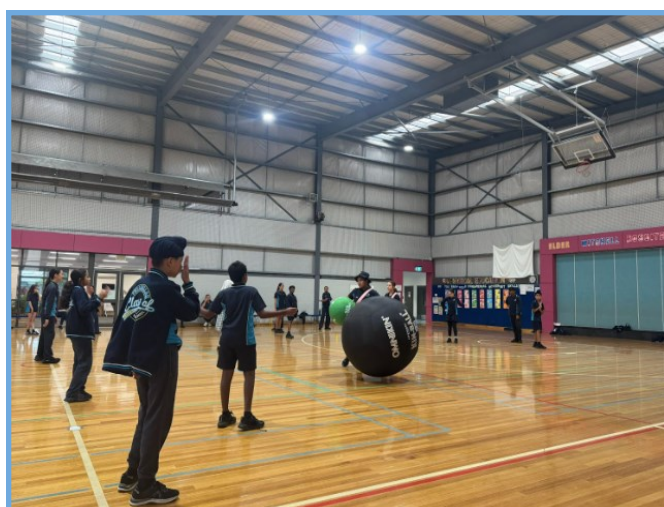
It was wonderful to see students engaging with the activity while learning that all living things grow and change in different ways throughout their life cycles.

MUSIC

Last week in Music Prep students continued to be creative with body beats, composing body beat patterns and rhythms.

Year One students learnt the importance of ostinato patterns and composed and performed their own ostinato (repeating pattern).

Year Two students continued to develop their sense of melody, composing their own melodic phrases and performing them with a partner.

Year Three students are learning how to play polyrhythms, combining composed rhythm patterns together to create interesting rhythm pieces.

Year Four students have finished their drama unit and are now learning some awesome hip hop dance moves.

Year Five and Six students finalised their guitar and keyboard unit by playing along to some popular songs, applying the chords and rhythm patterns that they have learnt throughout the term.

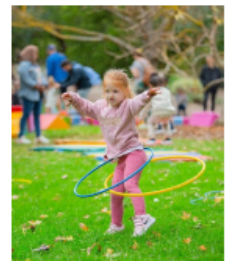

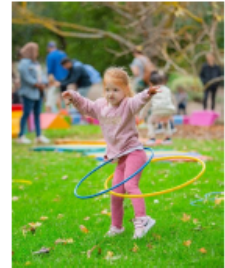


