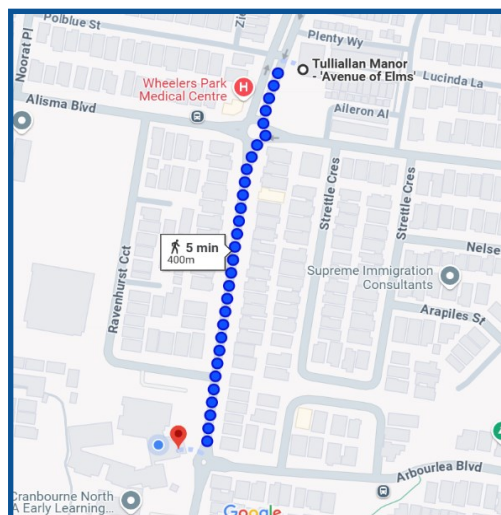
### **Meeting Time:**

## Nude Food at Tulliallan

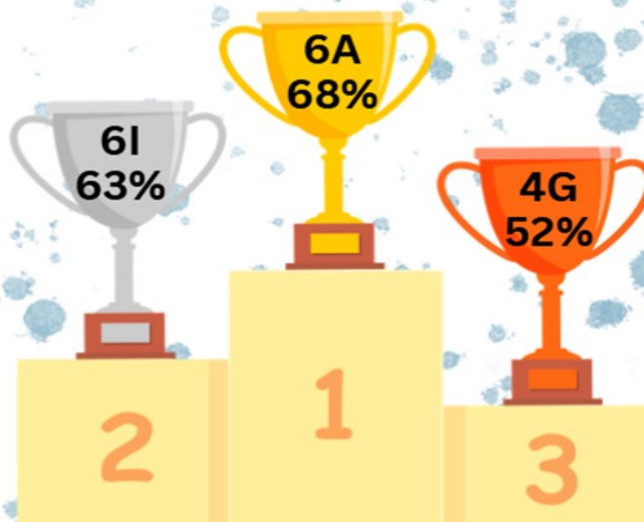

**Year 3 – 6:** Students are to read 15 books in total

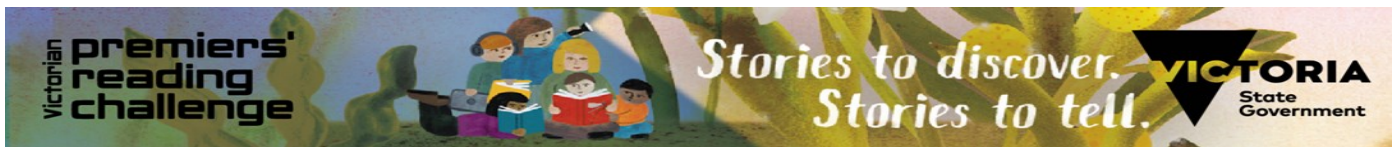

# WELLBEING

This is something you can talk to your children about at home.

<p><b>1 – Step Away</b></p>	<p>Remove yourself by walking away from a situation you don't like (thinking time and gives a choice of what to do next)</p>	
<p><b>2 – Speak Up</b></p>	<p>Talk to the person outlining what you don't like and why and how you can create a solution together.</p>	
<p><b>3 – Seek Help</b></p>	<p>Enlist the help of an adult if you cannot solve the issue</p>

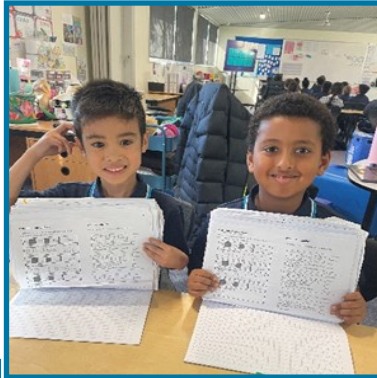
## YEAR TWO

Congratulations on another fantastic week, Year Two! It has been great to see everyone doing their best to follow our school expectations and show the values.

This week in Maths, the students have learned about four-digit numbers. They have expanded their understanding of place value and have compared numbers using 'greater than' and 'less than' symbols.

In English, the Year Two students have continued to enjoy reading 'The City of Light'. They have been exploring different sentence structures and using the conjunctions 'and', 'so', 'but', 'or' and 'because'.

Well done, Year Two!



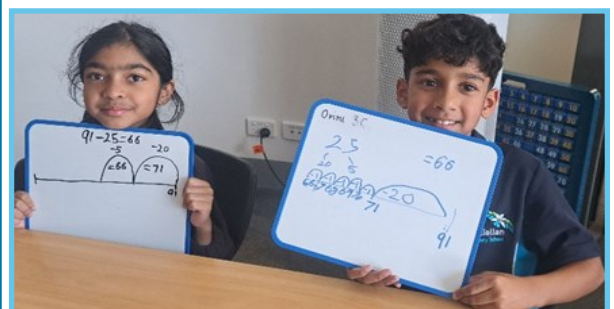
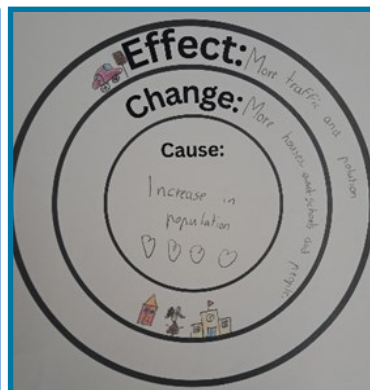
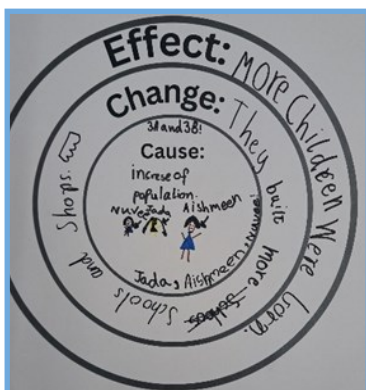
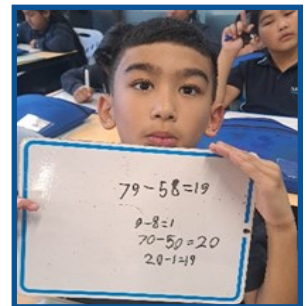
## YEAR THREE

Year Three students have had another busy and productive week full of learning! During our Integrated Learning unit, we have started learning about countries and looking to understand connections to our country. We are exploring local communities in Cranbourne and identifying how they have changed over time, by looking at old photographs of local landmarks. This connects to our current text study of *Yirra and her Deadly Dog*, which has been written by a group of indigenous students and uses many of their factual recounts and experiences within the text.

Students have been working on using adverbial phrases in their writing, to extend their sentences and have been reading aloud to continue to work on expression and fluency.

During Mathematics, students are able to revisit concepts learnt through the daily reviews – this ensures they are not forgetting important maths concepts as we go through our Fractions unit.

We are so proud of the engagement that our students are showing every day, and the way they have been organising their resources and focusing on their learning.

## YEAR FOUR

This week in Year Four, we have continued reading 'Uncle Xbox' and getting to know the main character, Dusty. We have also begun writing our Factual Recounts, ensuring we are using past tense and that we have our events written in chronological order.

In Maths we are gaining more confidence in recognising the place value of decimals to hundredths. We have been practising using decimals and hundredths charts to represent decimals.

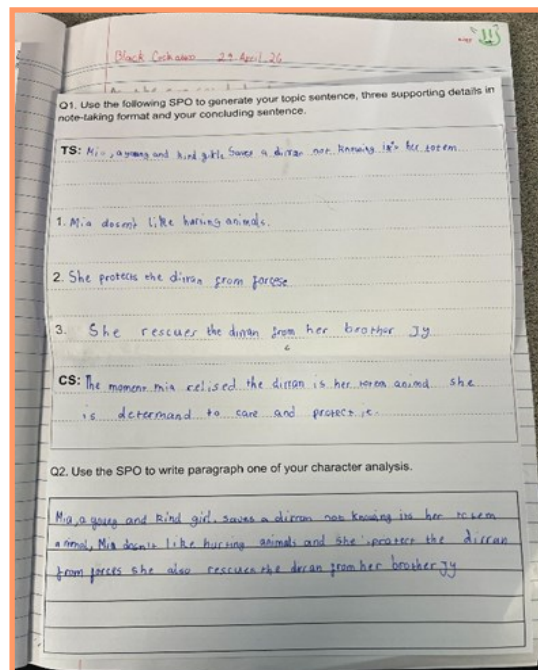
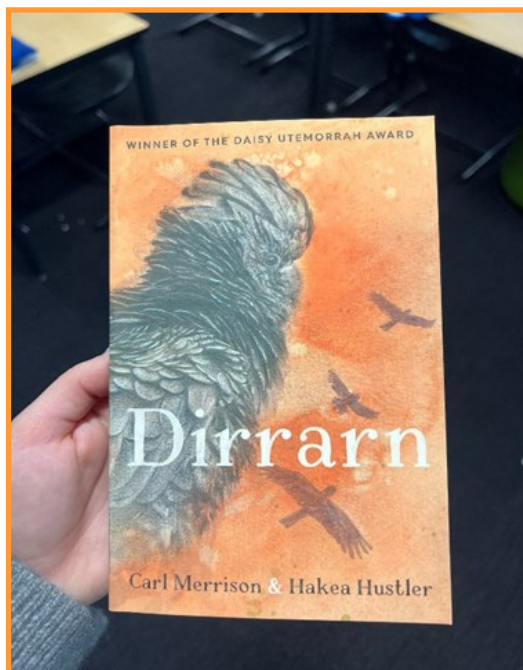

# SPECIALISTS

## MANDARIN

Last week in Mandarin, Prep students revised classroom routines in Mandarin such as 'he shui' (drinking water) and shang ce suo (going to the bathroom). They now know how to use these sentences in Mandarin when they need to make a request in class..

Our Year One and Two students were introduced to the names for furniture in the classroom such as tables and chairs. We played a game related to this vocabulary, which was really fun. They all loved it and said they wanted to play again!. Our Year Three and Four students continued revising the vocabulary for classroom stationery. They are now confident to use them in sentences to introduce what is inside their school bags.

Year Five and Six students started to research cities in China. It is no surprise that most of them chose to pick Beijing or Shanghai as their chosen city, some students did however select other cities to research such as Harbin, which is known as the Ice World. We cannot wait to see them start to make their travel brochures!



# SPECIALISTS

## VISUAL ARTS

This week, all Tulliallan students have been completing their badge designs for the upcoming Term Three school production. Each year level has a different part of the Production to design and illustrate on their badge. More information will be provided on the badges and the winning designs later this term.

The Prep students have also started working on their second artwork for Term Two. After listening to the story 'Bad Cat', students learned how to draw a cat using a variety of lines and shapes. They talked about the colours and texture of cats and they used paint sticks to colour their cat drawing.

## MUSIC

This week in Music and Performing Arts, Prep students explored keeping a steady beat through movement and percussion, while also identifying examples of music in their own lives and community.

Year One students continued to build their skills by recognising and performing simple rhythm patterns.

Year Two students worked within the xylophone unit, exploring tuned percussion through melody, bass and bordun patterns.

Year Three students developed their understanding of pitch through ukulele work, comparing sounds and practising chord changes.

Year Four students explored drama by focusing on characters and roles, building their performance skills through scripts and rehearsal.

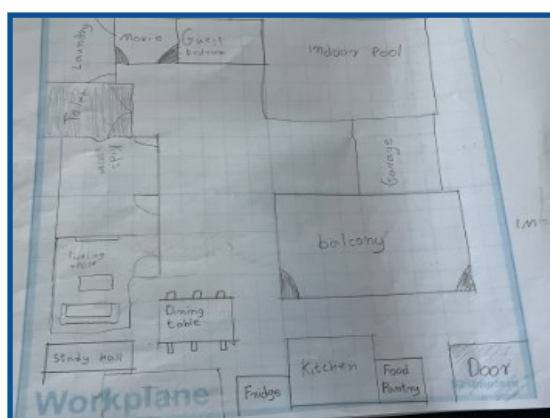
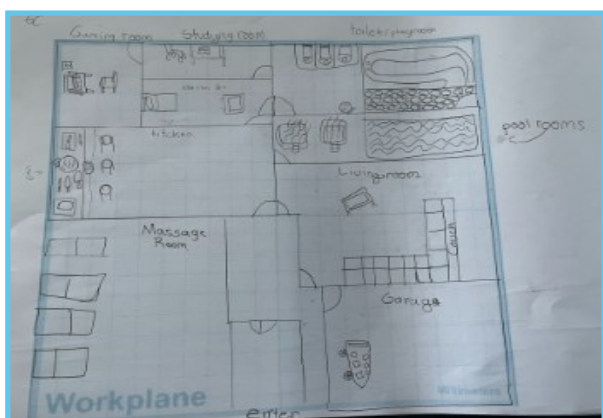
In Years Five and Six, students continued their guitar program, combining chords such as Em and G and revising chord progressions to build fluency in their playing.

# SPECIALISTS

## STEM

Our Year Five students have begun their Tinkercad journey with guided tutorials designed to build essential 3D design skills. They revisited the interface, explored key tools, and developed confidence as they experimented with basic shapes and functions. Soon, they will move into 2D design, working on a 20×20 workplane to create a floor plan of their own bedroom, an exciting first step toward more advanced digital design.

Year Six students have taken their Tinkercad skills to the next level. Building on prior knowledge, they learned how to construct walls, doors, and windows while refining their understanding of scale and accurate measurement. They are currently designing their own 2D apartment floor plans, applying precision and real world spatial reasoning. Once complete, they will bring these plans to life by transforming them into detailed 3D models in Tinkercad.



## PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Our District Cross Country went to Sweeney Reserve on the 29th of April to compete in the Narre Warren District Cross Country championship. We were extremely proud of the effort each student put into their race, we want to send out a huge congratulations to all 57 students who competed.
