This week's figures show a steady flow of late arrivals and early departures across all year levels, with Monday recording the highest number of late arrivals (76) and Wednesday the highest early departures (33). While these numbers highlight some ongoing challenges with punctuality and attendance routines, they also give us a valuable opportunity to work together to improve consistency for our students. It's encouraging to see that several year groups maintained relatively low figures on certain days - proving that positive routines are making a difference. Small improvements each day can have a big impact on learning time, wellbeing, and classroom momentum.

Helpful Reminders for Families

- Aim for an earlier start to the morning routine to reduce last-minute stress.
- Check transport and traffic conditions ahead of time where possible.
- Schedule appointments outside school hours whenever practical.
- Encourage students to prepare bags, uniforms, and devices the night before.

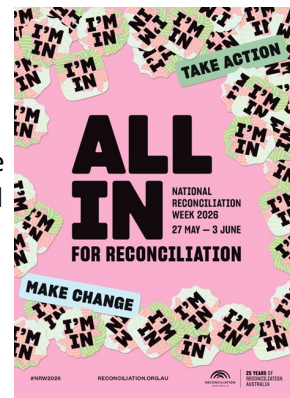


SEAN CHOOLBURRA 1st JUNE

FIRST AID IN SCHOOLS

This week Tulliallan students have participated in the 'First Aid in Schools' program. This free program teaches primary school students the importance of First Aid. They have roleplayed situations where they may need to ring '000' and how to administer CPR. A huge focus was done on DRSABCD which highlights what to do in an emergency. Students went through the steps of how to put someone in the recovery position. These basic skills can keep them safe and help to save a life.

Each student has received a certificate to show that they have completed the session.

Year 3 – 6: Students are to read 15 books in total

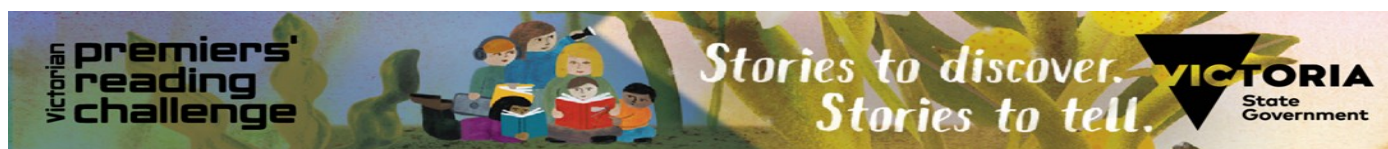

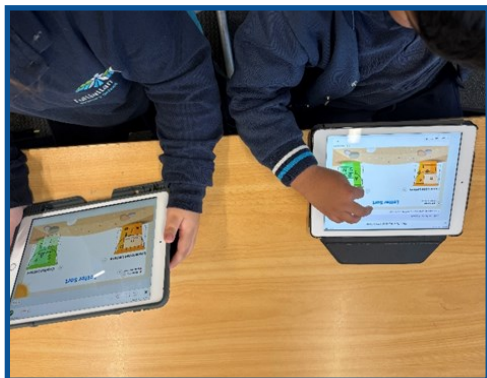
SCHOOL NEWS

Prep students have had a wonderful week of learning. In Maths, we explored number pairs 5 and 10, using 5 frames and 10 frames to build a strong number sense and confidence. It was fantastic to see students eagerly experimenting with different combinations and proudly sharing their discoveries.

In Digital Technology, students continued developing skills with the Seesaw app, learning how to navigate its features to document and share their learning. Their enthusiasm and growing independence have been a joy to watch, and we look forward to seeing them continue to shine.

YEAR ONE

What a wonderful week it has been in Year One! It has been great to see everyone doing their best to follow school expectations and demonstrate school values.

In Phonics, students have focused on the 'ph' and 'oo' sounds. They are doing a wonderful job at being able to identify when to use these sounds in words.

In English, we have continued our book 'The Most Magnificent Thing' and students have attempted to plan and write their own procedural text using time connective words such as 'first', 'next', 'then' and 'finally'.

In Mathematics, we have been focusing on measurement. Students have been doing lots of hands-on activities to explore the capacity of different containers. It's been wonderful to see them so engaged in learning.

The highlight of our week was seeing students continuing to construct their inquiry projects. We have some very strong and creative structures being built and we can't wait to see the final products!

YEAR TWO

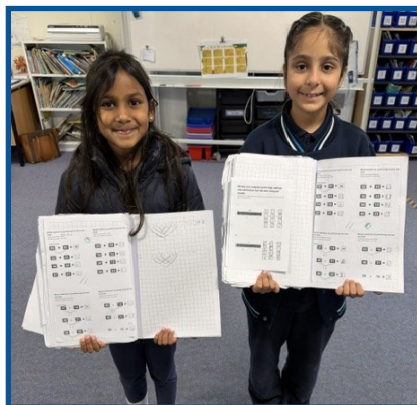
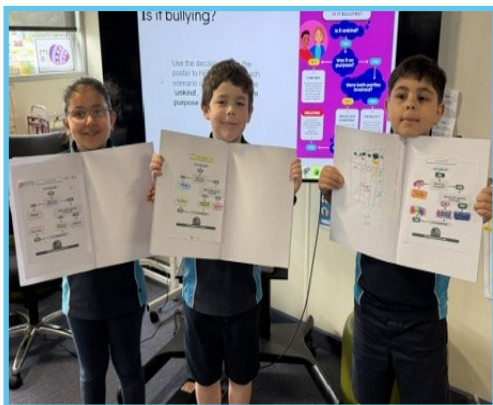
Well done to the wonderful Year Twos on another fantastic week! We have been busy learning about factual recounts. Students have been highly engaged with our focus text, *Curiosity: The Story of a Mars Rover*, and have been learning so much about what can be achieved through curiosity and ambition.

In Math's, we have been focusing on different strategies for solving addition and subtraction problems, including doubles facts and fact families.

In Integrated Learning, students have been comparing how our lives today differ from life in Australia during the 1960s.

Students have had a look at an "Is it Bullying?" poster for Wellbeing, so they can have a better understanding of the differences between bullying and unkind behaviour.

It has also been very exciting for students to finally be introduced to the Production songs that will be performed in August.

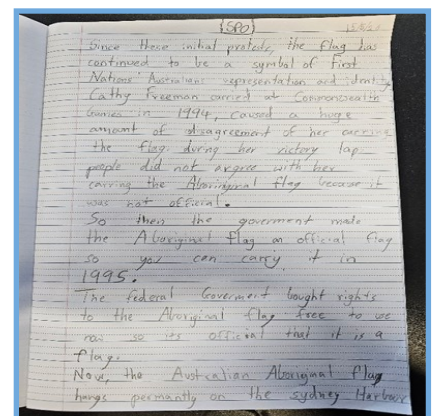


YEAR THREE

Year Three students have had another busy and exciting week of learning! With the beautiful sunshine and pleasant weather, students have thoroughly enjoyed spending time outdoors, playing, strengthening friendships, and collaborating with their peers. It has been wonderful to see their enthusiasm and active participation across all learning experiences.

In Mathematics, we have been exploring the concept of length. Students have been developing their skills in measuring, comparing, and ordering objects from shortest to longest using a range of hands-on activities and practical investigations.

During Literacy sessions, students continued their text study of the engaging story 'Yirra and Her Deadly Dog, Demon'. Students focused on building their writing skills by learning how to develop detailed body paragraphs and expand their Single Paragraph Outlines (SPOs). Students have shown great interest and enthusiasm during reading sessions and discussions with their teachers, demonstrating growing confidence in both their comprehension and writing abilities.

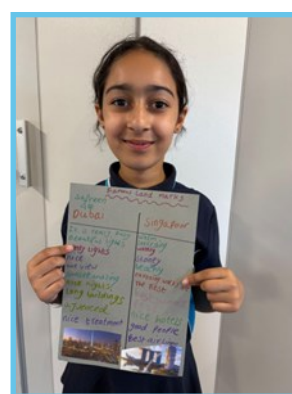
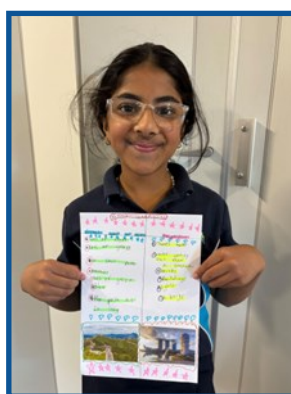
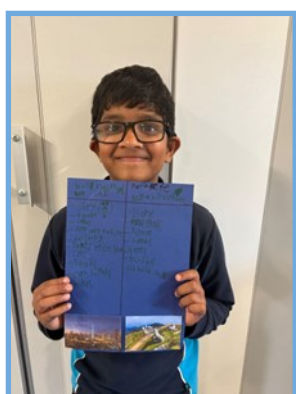
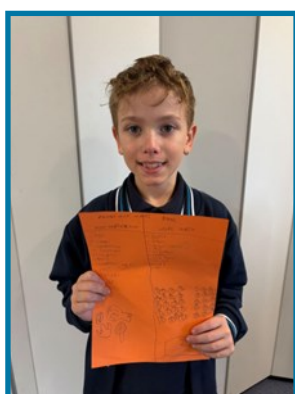
YEAR FOUR

Another fantastic week of learning in Year Four! During English we continued reading our novel 'Uncle Xbox'. In writing we have continued writing our factual recounts outlining the key events which occurred during the colonisation of Australia.

In Maths we have begun learning about area and perimeter. We have had fun measuring different lengths around the school using rulers, measuring tape and trundle wheels.

During integrated learning we discussed the importance of castles during Medieval Europe and their key features. Students then used their creativity and imagination to design their own marvellous castles.

Well done to everyone, we're looking forward to another fun week of learning!

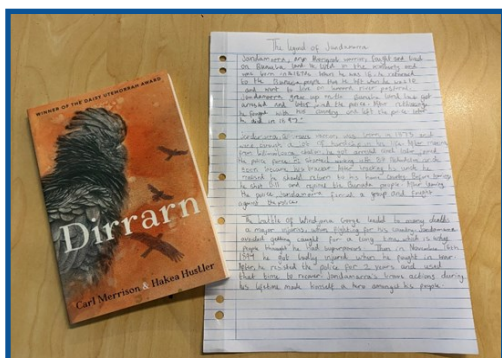


YEAR FIVE

What a busy week in Year Five! Students have continued reading 'Durrarn' during English. We have begun writing factual recounts about the Indigenous Warrior and Jandamarra. Students did an excellent job ensuring that they included action verbs, appositives, time connectives and past tense language within their writing pieces.

In Maths, we are learning about decimals. We have been exploring different ways to write decimals as well as placing them on a number line. The highlight of the week in Maths was consolidating our understanding of decimals through playing Decimal Duels.

During Integrated Learning we have begun our new Passion Project unit connecting to the book 'Waves.' Year Fives did a great job identifying the themes in the books relating to human rights.

YEAR SIX

This week in Year Six, students have completed our unit on Factual Recounts and have begun working on our character analysis for 'Us Mob Walawurru' on the character of Ruby.

In Maths we have been working on adding and subtracting, rounding and estimating and partitioning decimal numbers.

VISUAL ARTS

This week Years Five and Six have been working on a poster which shows different cardboard joining techniques. This will give students the skills they need when they begin working on their cardboard treehouses.

Well done on a great start to the unit!



MUSIC

The Music program has progressed significantly this term, with students engaging in diverse musical experiences.

Year Two students have focused on vocal repertoire, exploring cultural and popular pieces.

Year Three have developed ensemble skills by performing melodies and harmonies with cultural accompaniment.

In Year Four, students have applied foundational ukulele chords (C, Am, F) to popular repertoire.

Finally, Year Five and Six students have collaborated in small groups to compose original music, learning the essential elements of song structure, verse-chorus forms and rhythmic patterns.



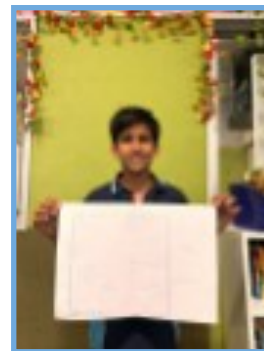
SPECIALISTS

STEM

This week in STEM, Grade Five students continued their learning about blueprints and floor plans. Students explored how architects and designers use scaled drawings to plan buildings and rooms before construction begins.

Using a workplane, students designed their own bedroom floor plan to scale, carefully adding walls, doors, windows, and furniture. They practised measurement, spatial thinking and problem-solving while considering how to organise a functional living space.

Some students also began transferring their designs into Tinkercad, using CAD (Computer-Aided Design) software to start building digital 3D versions of their bedrooms. This helped students connect their 2D blueprint designs to real 3D modelling and design processes.



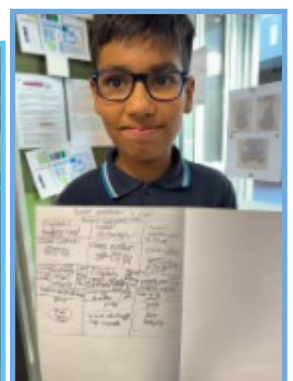
MANDARIN

Prep students learned how to say “thank you”, “you’re welcome”, “sorry” and “that’s okay” in Mandarin. They practised these phrases through simple group role-plays, helping them build confidence in using Mandarin in everyday situations.

Year One and Two students revised classroom vocabulary. Through games and repeated practice, students strengthened their speaking and writing of these familiar words.

Years Three and Four students learned how to say the days of the week from Monday to Friday in Mandarin. They practised their listening, speaking, reading and writing skills through a fun wheel game and other interactive activities.

Year Five and Six students continued working on their travel brochure project, with a focus this week on researching famous landmarks and places of interest in their chosen Chinese cities.



SPECIALISTS

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Students have been working extremely hard in their Physical Education lessons, focusing on building and refining a range of important skills. Prep to Year Two students have been developing fundamental movement skills such as overarm throwing, kicking, running, ball bouncing, dodging, and catching through engaging activities.

Years Three and Four, students have done a fantastic job learning volleyball skills, including the set and dig, and applying them in games of Grid Ball, where they have also practised self umpiring. Our Year Five and Six students have been applying their understanding of tactics and gameplay while playing basketball, showing strong teamwork and decision making. Well done to all students for their continued effort and positive attitude in PE lessons!
