We have also enjoyed reading the book *Giraffes Can't Dance* and *Moving and Grooving* in our Text Study lessons and we had so much fun learning about where animals lived and used that information to come up with sentences.

In Maths, we learnt about addition and number stories. We had a Mad about Science incursion on Thursday, where we explored different topics such as electricity, fire and air.

On Friday, we celebrated PJ Day! We are so proud of the Preps. Keep up the amazing work!

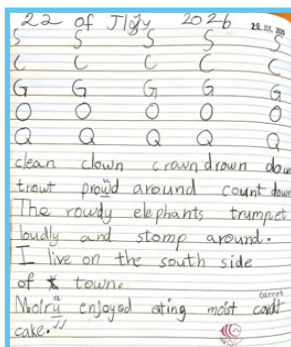


YEAR ONE



Year One students had an amazing time at our Mad About Science incursion last week where they got to observe and explore some of the properties of air, electricity and fire! Students were immersed throughout the session, witnessing smoke vortices, levitating beach balls, flying toilet paper, flour fireballs and much more. The excitement throughout the demonstrations was electric, with all students eagerly engaged.

In Phonics, students have been exploring the GPC's 'ow' as in 'clown' and 'ou' as in 'south', as well as the prefix 'un', as in 'unwind'. In Mathematics, the focus has been on length. Students have been using informal units to measure and compare the length of classroom objects. Take a look at them measuring using Unifix blocks!

YEAR TWO

This week Year Two students participated in the Mad about Science incursion where they were able to experience giant smoke rings, levitating beach balls, flying toilet paper and hair-raising static electricity!

During Maths we are looking at repeated addition and making arrays of 2, 5 and 10s. Then we started looking at *groups of* with our knowledge of our 2, 5, 10s repeated addition.

In English students have been looking at possessive adjectives and pronouns to use in sentences.

YEAR THREE

Welcome back to another eventful week of learning in the Year Three Learning Community! This week our students were lucky to participate in the Mad Science Incursion where they had the opportunity to see some science experiments with air, smoke, electricity and fire. Safe to say this incursion went off with a BANG!

During Literacy we have continued reading our text *The Iron Man* and have discovered some more about who the main character is. Students have really been enjoying practising their reading fluency and reading comprehension skills.

YEAR FOUR

Year Four students had a fantastic time participating in the Mad Science incursion, where they explored exciting scientific concepts through fun and interactive experiments. Several students were selected to take part in live demonstrations, making the experience even more engaging and memorable. The incursion sparked curiosity and encouraged students to think like young scientists.

YEAR FIVE

Year Five students had a fantastic time taking part in a Mad About Science incursion. They explored positive and negative electrical charges through demonstrations and hands-on activities.

Students created human circuits to learn how electricity flows through a complete circuit and experienced the effects of static electricity by using electrical charge to make their hair stand on end!

Ridhira from 5E said her favourite part was the flying fire teabag demonstration. This showed students that hot air rises because it is less dense than cool air.

Ekas from 5E enjoyed the air vortex cannon demonstration. This showed students that air is matter, even though we can't see it, it has mass and takes up space.

MAD SCIENCE INCURSION

Last week, students were treated to an exciting Mad Science Incursion held over three action-packed days. It was a fantastic opportunity for students from across the school to experience science in a fun, engaging and memorable way. The interactive science show explored fascinating concepts including air, electricity and fire through a series of exciting demonstrations. Students were amazed as they watched giant smoke rings float through the air, beach balls appear to levitate, toilet paper soar across the room, spectacular flour fireballs light up the stage and static electricity create hilarious "hair-raising" moments!

Many students eagerly volunteered to take part in the experiments, becoming junior scientists for the day. Their enthusiasm and curiosity helped bring the demonstrations to life, while the audience cheered them on. Some experiments included unexpected surprises that left students laughing, amazed and wondering, "How did that happen?" These moments sparked plenty of discussion and encouraged students to think like scientists by making observations, asking questions and predicting outcomes.

Throughout the show, students discovered how different scientific forces and energy can produce amazing effects. They explored how air pressure can move objects, how static electricity can attract and repel and how fire must be handled safely while demonstrating interesting scientific principles. The incursion helped students connect classroom learning with real-world science in an exciting and meaningful way.

The Mad Science Show inspired curiosity, creativity and a love of scientific discovery. It was wonderful to see so many enthusiastic faces, thoughtful questions and budding scientists eager to learn more about the world around them.

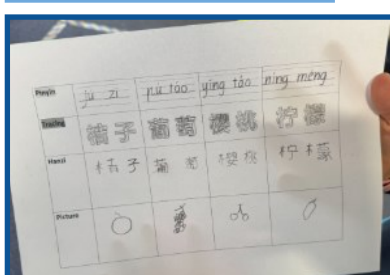
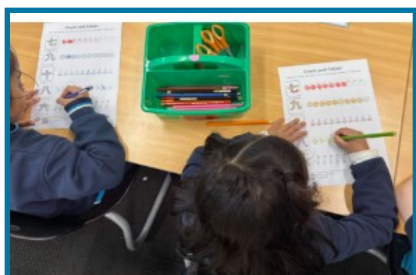
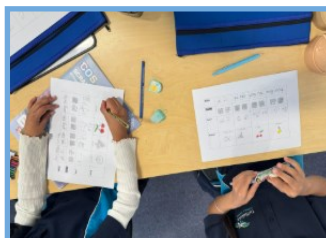
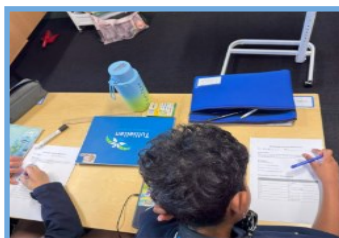
MANDARIN

It has been another exciting week of learning in Mandarin! Prep students continued to build their confidence by revising numbers in Chinese through songs, games and interactive activities. They are now more confident in recognising and saying numbers in Chinese while having lots of fun.

In Year One and Two, students expanded their fruit vocabulary. Our Year Two students also learned to express their fruit preferences by using simple sentence patterns such as "I like to eat...". It has been wonderful to see students becoming more confident in using Mandarin to communicate about their own likes and dislikes.

Year Three and Four students began the exciting new topic of sports. Through movement based learning, role play and action games, students connected physical actions with new vocabulary, making their learning both memorable and enjoyable.

Our Year Five and Six students explored Chinese currency and exchange rates as part of their learning about this term's topic Earn and Learn. Students enjoyed making real world connections between mathematics, geography and language learning.



MUSIC

This week in Music and Performing Arts, Prep students explored the musical element of pitch by singing, chanting, acting and playing tuned and untuned percussion instruments to represent different characters through high and low sounds.

Year One and Two students practised singing *The River* with accurate pitch while creating accompanying dance moves, developing confidence in both music and movement.

Year Three and Four students used 4/4 time, tactile rhythm patterns, object coordination and deliberate rests with plastic cups to create engaging rhythmic performances.



In Years Five and Six, students explored music production in BandLab, learning how to change the texture of a song by adding and manipulating audio effects to enhance their compositions.
