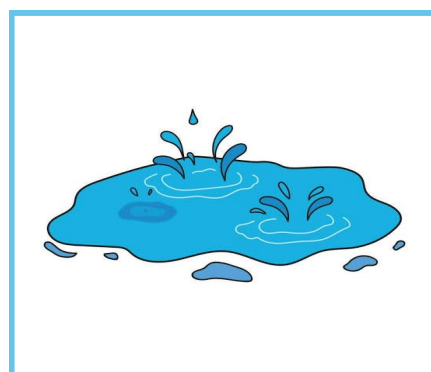
When picking up your child after the show, please make sure you get your child checked off by their teacher, before you take them home.

WET WEATHER

The wet weather brings with it puddles and mud in the school grounds. We encourage our students to stay on the dry areas and often close the oval when it is under water. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION DIGITAL LEARNING POLICY 2027 INCLUDING THE ENDING OF BYOD PROGRAMS FOR PRIMARY SCHOOLS.

As mentioned last year on COMPASS, the Department of Education advised schools that from 2027 Government schools will no longer be able to offer the BYOD Programs, so 2026 was the last time that Tulliallan could invite parents who have students in Years Three to Six to access this program to purchase their own computer.

THE RECENTLY UPDATED DIGITAL LEARNING POLICY STATES:

From 2027, schools with primary students must not invite or allow families to purchase or bring their own devices for school use from Years P–6.

At the school's discretion, primary students who have been using BYO devices prior to 2027 **can continue using their devices until they need to be replaced.** This means that those students who have their own **approved EDUNET device prior to 2027 which has the Edustar image and warranty for repairs can still bring this device to school if parents wish for 2027 and beyond.**

Families may have heard about the direction from the Department of Education about limiting time on devices at school other than where the Victorian Curriculum F–10 Version 2.0 requires use. Due to our new approach to teaching and learning under the Victorian Teaching and Learning and Teaching Model 2.0, the reduction of time on devices is already evident. This is also evident at home with the introduction of the Homework Books.

Families can be reassured that our school is already well resourced for students to have access to shared devices to use in 2027. iPads for Prep to Year Two use and Laptops for Years Three to Six.

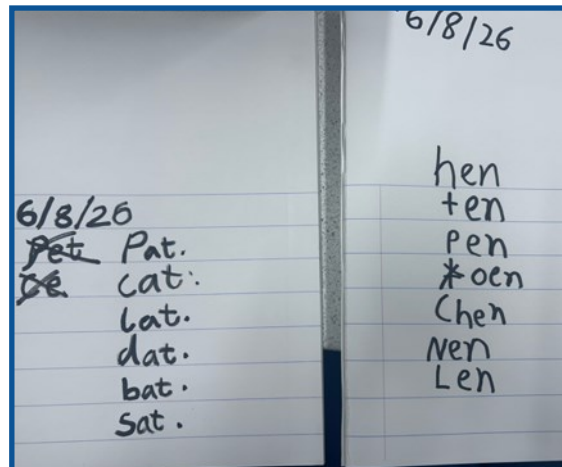

6. **Check in** regularly with your child.

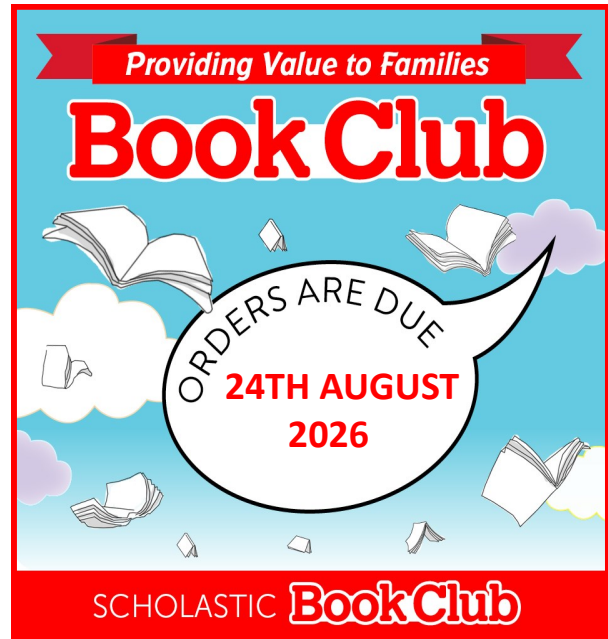

In Maths, students explored the attributes of mass, capacity, length and duration and used direct comparison strategies to compare objects and events. It was fantastic to see students eagerly experimenting with different units of measurements proudly sharing their discoveries.

During Text Study, students have been using their story map planners to create and write their own narrative including the character, setting, problem and solution. It is so great to see students' creativity and imagination come through!

Students have continued enthusiastically participating in Production rehearsals, proudly representing their House colours. Their energy, commitment and teamwork have been wonderful to see and they are making excellent progress as they prepare for the upcoming performance. Awesome work, Preps!



YEAR ONE

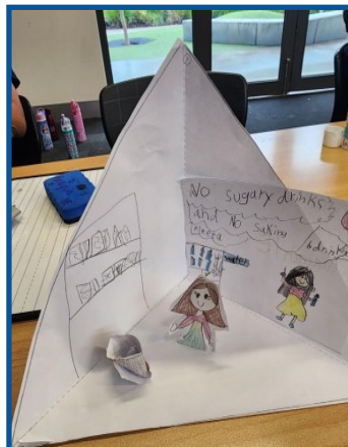
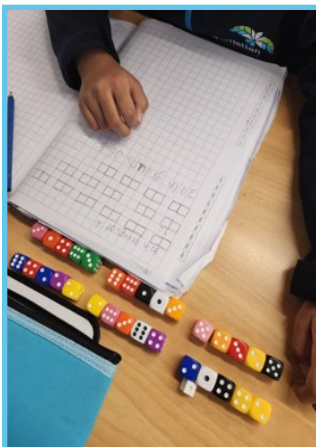
Another busy week of learning in Year One! In Phonics, we have continued to learn different ways to make the 'or' sound in words, including 'ore', 'aw' and 'au'.

In English, we worked on creating our own narratives using similar themes and ideas to our mentor text *Jetty Jumping*. It was great to see everyone using their imagination to create their own stories.

Maths has focused on making patterns and skip counting by 2s, 5s and 10s.

Teachers were very impressed to see the student's Inquiry trioramas come to life, as they began to create their own health message.

Finally, a very special week for our Principal's. We celebrated Principals Day and created flowers full of messages to celebrate the hard-working Principals at Tulliallan.

YEAR TWO

This week, Year Two students had their dress rehearsals for their upcoming Production. They are all very excited, and a little nervous, about performing at Bunjil Place next week.

In English, we have started reading a new text that explores one of Australia's most ancient ecosystems in Gagudju Country.

In Math's, we have been focusing on 2D shapes and learning about their attributes, including the number of sides and corners they have.

Lastly, the students also created passports to show the Snail and Whale's journey around the world from the text *The Snail And The Whale*.



YEAR THREE

Year Three students have had another busy and productive week of learning, with wonderful enthusiasm and effort shown across all learning areas.

During Literacy students focused on writing the third body paragraph of their information reports. They gathered key information from their research, collaborated their ideas and worked on organising facts into clear and informative paragraphs. It has been fantastic to see students becoming more confident in using research to support their writing.

In Mathematics this week, students learnt how to identify and read both analogue and digital time. They explored important time vocabulary, including quarter past, quarter to and how to tell the time using minutes past and minutes to the hour. Students enjoyed practising these skills through a range of engaging activities.

In Inquiry students began bringing their blueprint designs to life by constructing their problem-solving machines. It was wonderful to see their creativity, enthusiasm and imagination as they carefully built and refined their designs using a variety of materials.

During Wellbeing, students reflected on their individual strengths and explored how they use these strengths within the school environment. They shared examples of how their unique qualities help them learn, work with others and contribute positively to our classroom community.

Students continued working hard in preparation for our upcoming Production. They enthusiastically practised their songs and dance routines, demonstrating great determination, growing confidence and excellent teamwork. It has been wonderful to see everyone enjoying the rehearsals while developing their performance skills.

We are incredibly proud of the positive attitude, resilience and effort our Year Three students have shown throughout the week. We look forward to another exciting week of learning ahead!

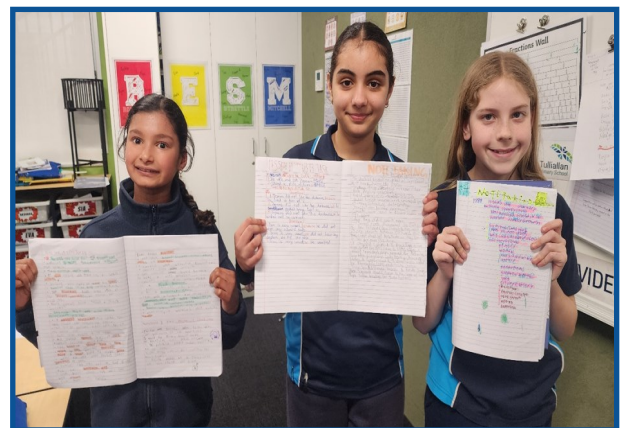
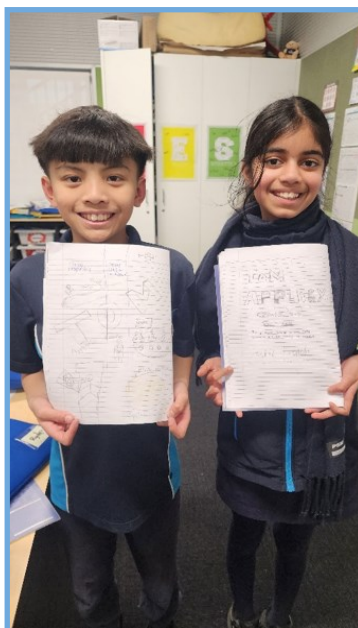
In English, we are finishing up our unit about our text *Storm Boy*. We have learned so much about Information reports and have learned a lot about the Coorong.

YEAR SIX

We are so excited for Production next week! The Year Six students have been working incredibly hard to make their final primary school production the best one yet. Our dress rehearsals this week put the finishing touches on our routines. We look forward to sharing all our hard work with you next week on stage at Bunjil Place.



STEM

Year Five and Six students have been busy exploring the fascinating world of light through a combination of demonstrations and hands-on investigations. They discovered how light travels in straight lines, investigated reflection and refraction, explored transparent, translucent and opaque materials and uncovered the colours hidden within white light using prisms. Students also investigated how our eyes allow us to see and they recorded their discoveries in their very own Light Investigation Journal. The highlight for many students was experimenting with lasers, mirrors, lenses and optical illusions while discovering that science is full of surprises. It has been wonderful to see curiosity, teamwork and scientific thinking on display throughout the unit.

VISUAL ARTS

Last week we held our first Art Exhibition displaying Year Five and Six cardboard treehouses. We received a lot of positive feedback from parents and families about the quality of work our students have done. We had 96 treehouses enter the exhibition which was an incredible achievement. Well done to all our students for the hard work, time and effort they put into completing this unit.



Our Year One and Two students have begun their modelling unit using paper, clay and wooden sea animals. They have learned how to manipulate the clay and include details adding beads and using clay tools.



SPECIALISTS

MANDARIN

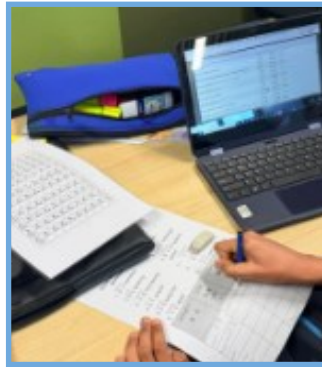
What another great week of learning in Mandarin! Prep students continued learning body parts, including 眼睛 eyes, 耳朵 ears, 鼻子 nose and 嘴 mouth. They practised the new vocabulary through songs and actions.

Year One and Two students revised fruit vocabulary and practised using simple sentences to talk about the fruit they like. They also enjoyed matching pictures with the correct Mandarin words to strengthen their recognition and recall.

In Year Three and Four, students learned action verbs to describe different sports. They also explored Chinese character radicals and how they can give clues about a character's meaning.

Years Five and Six students continued their Earn and Learn Project, exploring the difference between goods and services. They also investigated the prices of different goods and services in China.

This week in our Language and Culture Club, students also had the opportunity to learn some Korean. Everyone showed great interest and enthusiasm in exploring a new language and culture!



MUSIC

Last week Prep students learnt a fun pirate song whilst creating their own pirate dances. They practised keeping a steady beat, copying rhythms and moving to music.

Year One and Two students worked in groups to create a 'healthy' workout using exercises, stretches and dance moves. They used a beat from GarageBand to practise their routines and added their own lyrics.

In Year Three and Four students learnt different rhythms, including minim rests using the numbers one to eight. They practised remembering and playing the rhythms in order over four bars. Students used body percussion, Boomwhackers, cups and percussion instruments. This activity helps develop memory, concentration and coordination.

In Year Five and Six students are exploring how to change the texture of a song by adding and manipulating different effects in BandLab. They have experimented with sounds, layers and effects to create different moods and textures in music. Students are working with the song *Birds of a Feather*, exploring how changes to the sound can transform the way the music feels and sounds.
