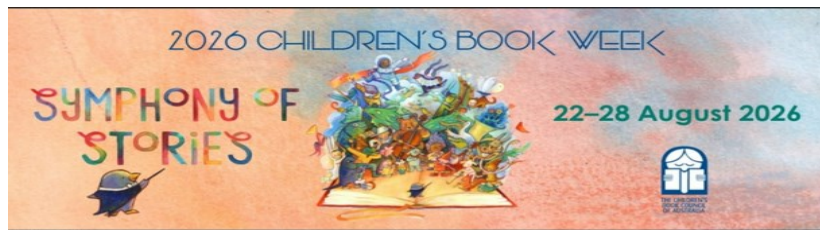

The standard of spelling throughout the competition was extremely high but it was Tulliallan Primary students that came out on top.

In Year Five Joanna did an amazing job but went out on the word 'vacuum' which placed her in 5th Position. Sisilia spelt incredibly well through the competition and come away with 1st place. ASSISTANT PRINCIPALS' REPORT

LATE ARRIVALS/EARLY DEPARTURES

Our most recent data recorded 267 late arrivals and 130 early departures across five school days. This equates to an average of 53 late arrivals and 26 early departures each day. While there have been some encouraging improvements, these numbers remain too high and represent a significant amount of missed learning time.

Arriving on time allows students to settle calmly, participate in important morning routines and access the beginning of explicit teaching. Similarly, leaving early can result in students missing lesson content, feedback and opportunities to consolidate their learning.

We ask all families to wherever possible, please schedule appointments outside school hours. We appreciate your support in improving attendance and ensuring every student can access every learning opportunity.

BULLYING. NO WAY! SMALL ACTS, BIG IMPACT



Between the 17th to the 21st of August is National Action against bullying and violence. At Tulliallan Primary School we aim to create a safe and supportive school community for everyone.

The theme for 2026 is 'Small Acts, Big Impact'.

Putting a stop to bullying is everyone's responsibility and small acts make a real difference. Small actions like including someone, speaking up or showing kindness can create meaningful change. This year's theme reminds us that actions don't need to be big to change someone's world.

In our school community our goal is to build environments where everyone belongs, diversity is celebrated and bullying is never accepted. During Bully No Way Week, we encourage students, families and our community to engage in **small acts that can have a big impact against bullying**.

During this week Learning Communities will make '**Small Acts, Big Impact**' a focus in their Wellbeing lessons and throughout the week.

Parents, you are an important part of our work to prevent bullying and to respond effectively if it happens. Stopping bullying involves everyone.

We are sending you a pocket card from Bullying No Way! with tips on what to do if your child talks to you about bullying. Parents know their children best and know the best way to tailor communication to their needs. Adapt these tips to what works for you and your child.

Let's work together to show kindness to everyone.

BULLYING. NO WAY!

If your child talks to you about bullying:

1. **Listen** calmly and get the full story.
2. **Reassure** your child that they are not to blame.
3. **Ask** your child what they want to do about it and how you can help.
4. **Visit** www.bullyingnoway.gov.au to find some strategies.
5. **Contact** the school.
6. **Check in** regularly with your child.

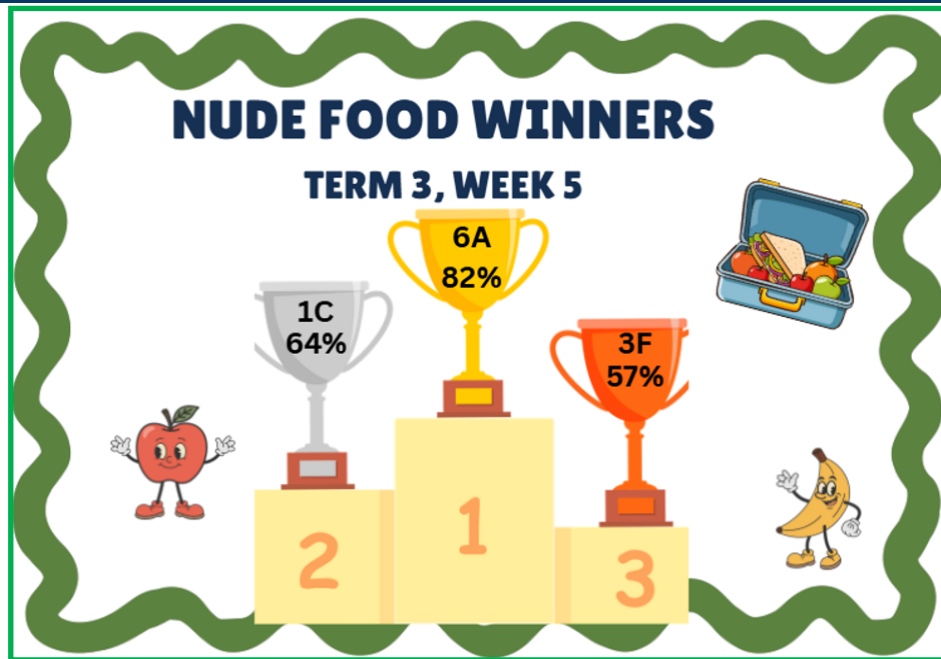

In our group with Alkira Secondary students we played some team building games, we played footy on the oval. We had a sausage sizzle for lunch and then did some colouring and scratch art. We used paint pens to draw Indigenous symbols on a canvas for school. Our last activity was learning about Aboriginal language, animals and musical instruments like the Yidaki (didgeridoo). My favourite part was playing the footy game with our Alkira friends. Participating in this day made me feel happy and proud.



Chayse:

We had a cookie when we arrived and a sausage sizzle for lunch. We played some fun games and footy with our friends from Alkira. We felt a possum skin and played the clap sticks. 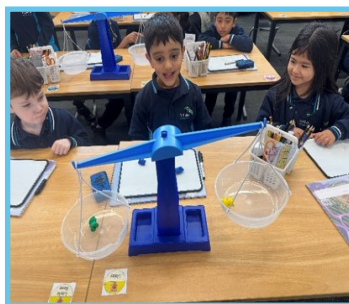

PREP

Preps have had another amazing week. We have been practising for Production in our House colours, making sure we know the songs and dances. We are so excited to perform in front of all the families.

In Phonics we have been learning about when to use double letters such as ll, ss and zz to spell words.

During Maths, we focused on mass and weight. We learned that just because something is big it doesn't mean it has a large mass or is heavy. Preps had a chance to lift objects -measuring the mass by holding items in their hands and comparing their weight. They also had opportunity to use balance scales to compare mass.



YEAR ONE

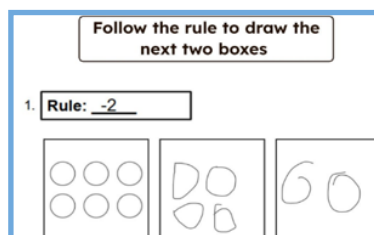
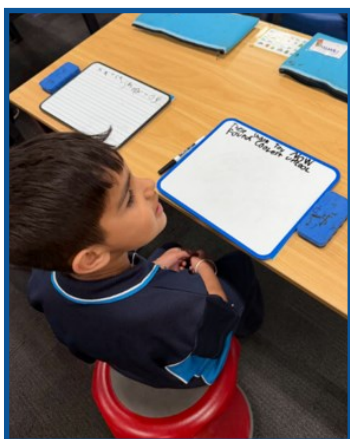
What a wonderfully jam-packed week of learning we have had in Year One!

In Phonics, we had an assessment to wrap up our learning of the /or/ sound, spelt like 'ore', 'aw' and 'au'. We are now excited to begin our next phonics set, starting with the /oo/ sound.

In English, students completed their writing assessment. They planned and wrote a Narrative about a time when someone tried something new. All students did well to include who or what helped their main character feel 'brave' in their stories. We loved seeing their creative storytelling!

For Mathematics, students explored how skip counting helping them identify and create growing patterns, even using Seesaw to demonstrate their understanding.

It was amazing to see students work hard in their lessons this week, as well as diligently practising their Production dances in our whole school dress rehearsals. Well done!

YEAR TWO

We have had another exciting and busy week in Year Two! In English, we started reading our new focus text *Walking in Gagudju Country: Exploring the Monsoon Forest*. We enjoyed learning about the sights of Kakadu National Park and the Kundjeyhmi words for what we might see there. We made text-to-self-connections, thinking about how the places and events in the book connect to our own experiences.

In Mathematics, we have been learning about 2D shapes. Students explored polygons and practised identifying shapes by their properties.

In Integrated Learning, students continued their Geography unit inspired by the *Snail and the Whale*, exploring Australian landmarks and practising locating places on a map.

It has been wonderful to see the enthusiasm and effort our Year Two students have shown throughout the week.

YEAR THREE

In Week Five, students finished reading the *Iron Man* text and continued to learn about prefixes and contraction words. They all gave writing complex sentences a go. Students also proudly published an information report of their chosen technology in Google Classroom after finishing writing it down on paper.

In Maths, Year Three students continued to learn about analog and digital time and how to match them.

Year Three students started to refine their inquiry project and bring their idea of the machine into prototypes.

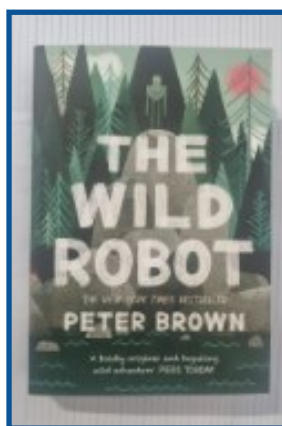
YEAR FOUR

We can't wait to see all of our students perform this week, we have been working hard so we can't wait to see the results!

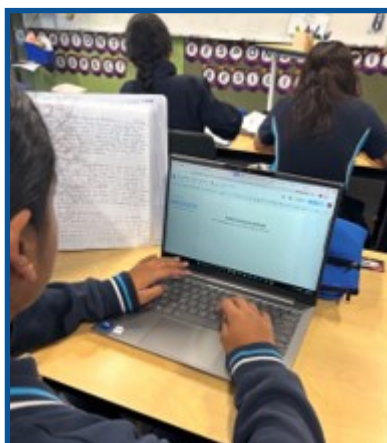


YEAR FIVE

Our Year Five students have been practising for the upcoming Production performance and are looking forward to performing on stage with all their friends!



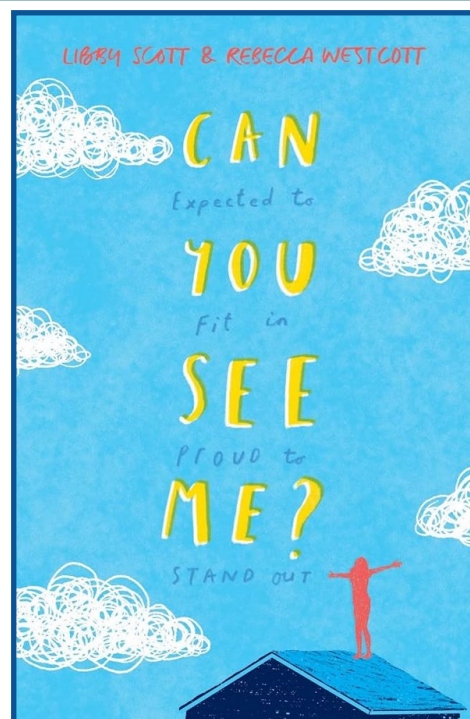

This week, our Year Six students embarked on their new novel study, diving into *Can You See Me?* by Libby Scott.

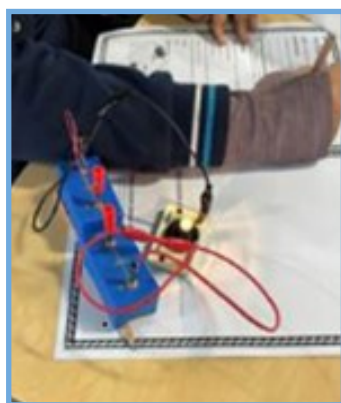
The story follows Tally, a relatable and courageous character navigating one of life's biggest milestones, the transition to high school.

STEM

Over the last couple of weeks, Year Five and Six students became electrical engineers as they investigated how electric circuits work. Through a series of hands-on investigations, students created series and parallel circuits, tested conductors and insulators, explored switches, motors and buzzers and discovered how electrical energy can be transformed into light, sound and movement. They worked collaboratively through four practical investigation stations, recording their observations and developing their scientific thinking along the way. It has been fantastic to see students confidently using scientific vocabulary and solving problems like real scientists!

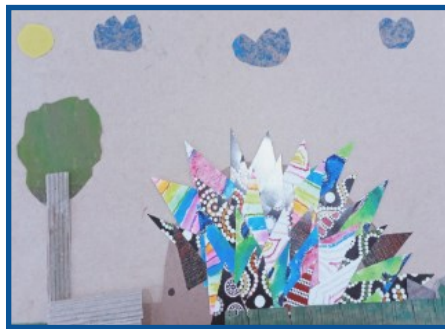


SPECIALISTS

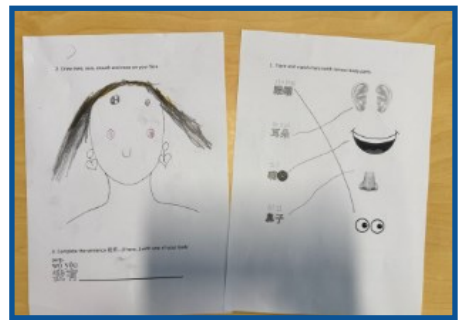
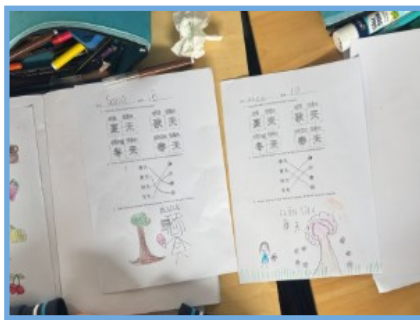
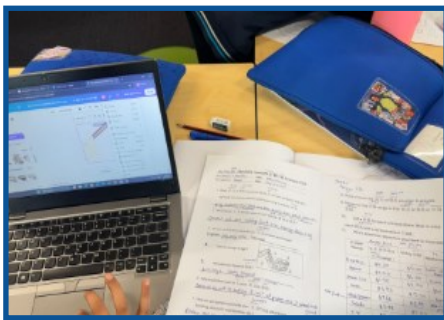
MANDARIN

This week, our Prep students continued learning about body parts. They practised listening to and identifying different body parts in Mandarin through interactive games and movement activities. Students enjoyed following the actions while singing along in Mandarin, this helped them develop their listening skills, pronunciation and confidence.

Students in Year One and Two learned about the four seasons in Mandarin. They practised recognising and saying the pronunciation through songs, repetition and classroom discussions. Students had opportunities to listen to and use seasonal vocabulary in context.
